Infant (0 to 12 months)

Soft cover or cardboard books, rattles, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip onto strollers or cribs, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, crib mirrors, busy boxes, light up toys, musical toys, Oballs, Lamaze, Bright Start, and Sassy brand crib toys are great. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for infants. Be aware of choking hazards.

Toddler (1 to 3)

Soft cover or cardboard books, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip onto strollers or cribs, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, musical toys, pillow-cases, fun socks, chunky crayons, coloring books, picture flashcards, bubbles, Play-Doh, plastic cars, small dolls. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for children under 3. Be aware of choking hazards.

Preschool (3 to 5)

Crayons, coloring books, grab-n-go activity kits, Play-Doh, books, stickers and sticker work books, matchbox cars, nerf or rubber balls, stuffed animals, flash cards, bubbles, fun socks, small action figures, small dolls, travel size games, Silly Putty, simple puzzles, colorful pillowcases, princess crowns & dress up items, toy farm animals and dinosaurs, activity books, card games such as Go Fish, Old Maid, matching games. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for Preschoolers.

Elementary (5 to 8)

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, coloring books, word searches, activity books, reading books, matchbox cars, nerf balls, stuffed animals, stickers, Play-doh, Silly Putty, flash cards, Lego kits, travel games, craft kits, joke books, hand lotion, craft kits, colorful pillow case, fun socks, Slinky, My Little Pony, action figures, puzzles, deck of cards, UNO card game. Twins & Teens (8 and up)

- ***Please call us when your child will be absent from their class at 627-4889.***
- Class will meet once a week for 6 weeks.
- Class begins right after school and ends at **4:30 sharp**. There will be an additional charge of **\$25 for every 15 minutes late**.
- Parents are responsible for their child's transportation home.
- Pick up will be at the **classroom**. Classroom assignments will be posted at the Security Guard's desk. **All must enter and exit through the School's front doors when picking up from ELO.**
- Classes will not be held on holidays, days of early dismissal or when school is closed due to inclement weather.
- ***Parents will be notified by the district's K12 Alert when ELO classes are cancelled due to bad weather or other circumstances. Students will be instructed to go home on their regular dismissal bus at 3:30. It is the responsibility of the parent to have their updated contact information on K12 Alert.***
- If classes are canceled for any reason an extra class will be added at the end of the session.
- The School Nurse is not on the premises during ELO. There is no access to any of the medication in her office.
- There are a limited number of spaces available for each class. Please fill out the permission form & return it in an **envelope marked Family Resource Center** to school with a check made out to **Nanuet FRC by April 13, 2018.**
