Dear Parent/Guardian,

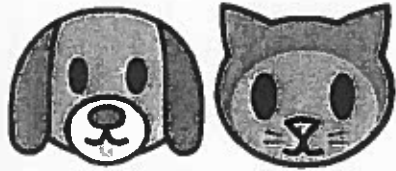

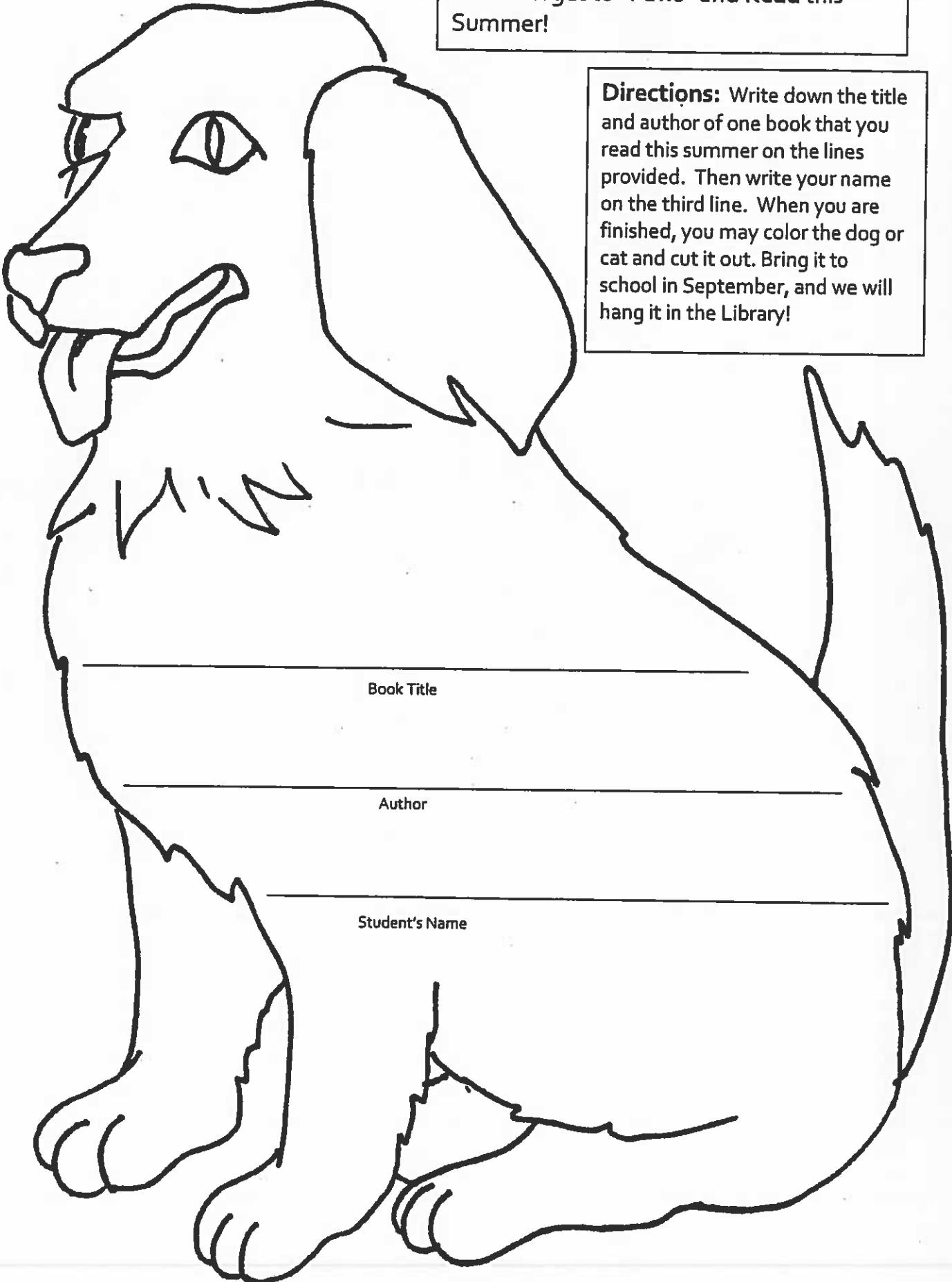

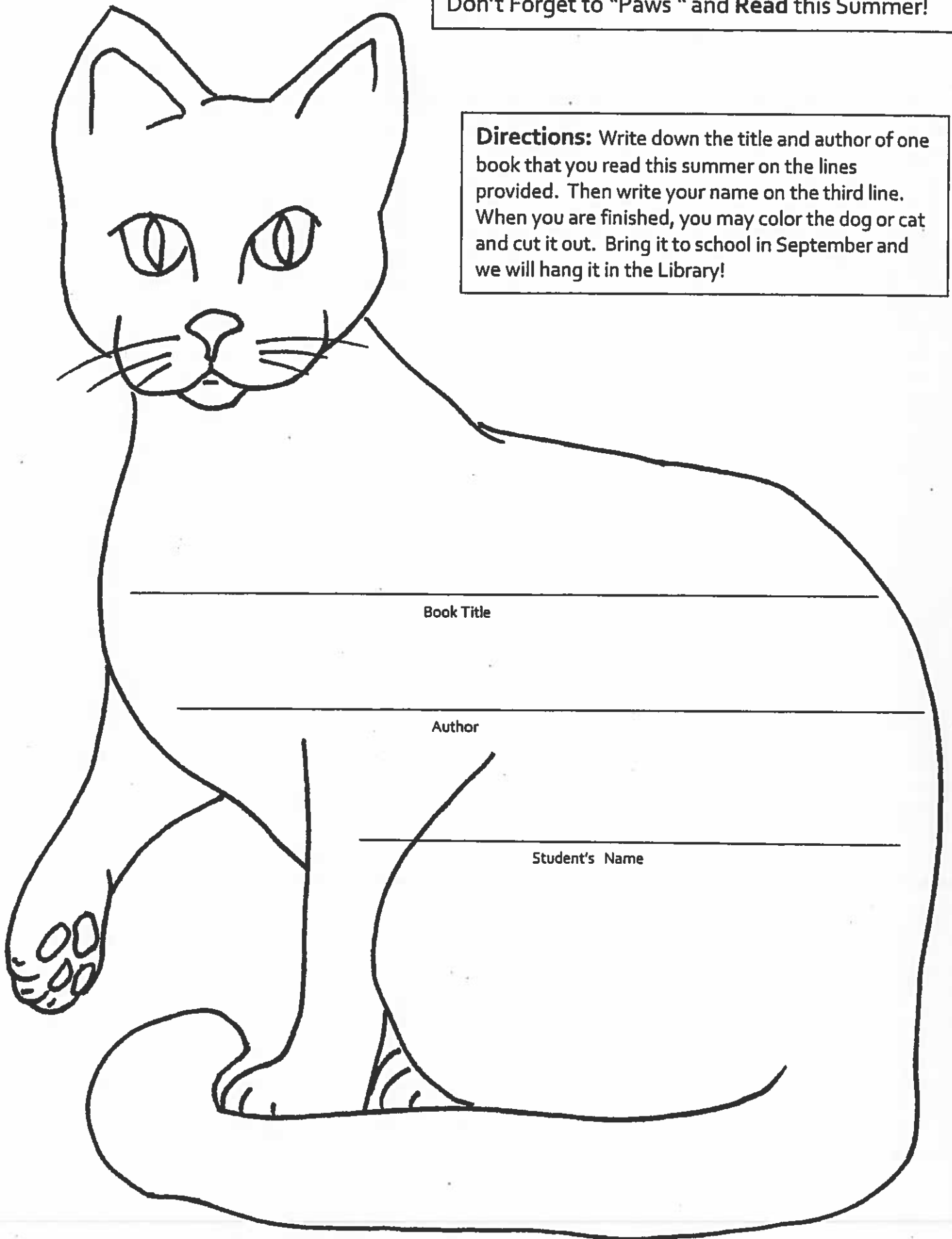

Like dogs or cats? Just take a look at these books-----

Applegate, Katherine. Don't Swap Your Sweater for a Dog. Determined to win a trophy of some kind, first-grader Roscoe swaps a hand-knitted sweater from his grandmother for the chance to enter his new neighbor's very clever dog in a trick contest.

Bruel, Nick. Happy Birthday Bad Kitty. Bad Kitty's birthday fun is disrupted when someone takes off with her parents and an unexpected guest arrives for the party.

Buckley, Carol. Tarra & Bella: the elephant and dog who became best friends. Recounts the true story of Tarra, an elephant who befriended a stray dog named Bella at the Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee.

Catalanotto, Peter. Ivan the Terrier. The story about a terrier named Ivan who keep interrupting story hour.

DeGroat, Diane. Dogs Don't Brush Their Teeth! Photographs, illustrations, and fold-out pages introduce the reader to fifteen different dogs who show what they can and cannot do.

Dennis, Brian. Nubs: a Mutt, a Marine & a Miracle. The story of how Nubs and a Marine who became good buddies in Iraq are re-united in the United States.

Harvey, Tom and Allie. Tiger Pups. The true story of three white Bengal tiger cubs who were cared for by a golden retriever named Isabella, when their own mother stopped caring for them.

Hest, Amy. The Dog who Belonged to No One. The hard-working daughter of two bakers and a perfectly nice stray dog live lonely lives in the same town, until they meet one very stormy day.

Hills, Tad. How Rocket Learned to Read. A little yellow bird teaches Rocket the dog how to read by first introducing him to the alphabet.

Himmelman, John. Katie Loves the Kittens. Sara Ann brings home three little kittens, but Katie the dog's enthusiasm scares the kittens, until she learned that being more patient brings about friendship.

Jenkins, Steve. Dogs and Cats. Two related works, one about dogs with some comparisons to cats and one about cats with some comparisons to dogs.

Larson, Kirby. Two Bobbies: a true story of Hurricane Katrina, friendship, and survival. Tells the true story of Bobbie the dog and Bob Cat, two pets who bonded together and were able to survive the devastation of Hurricane Katrina.

Meyers, Susan. Kittens! Kittens! Kittens! Illustrations and rhyming text portray kittens as they go from nesting newborns to proud, independent, and ready to have kittens of their own.

Numeroff, Laura Joffe. If You Give a Cat a Cupcake. A series of increasingly far-fetched events might occur if someone were to give a cupcake to a cat.

Parish, Herman. Amelia Bedelia and the Cat. Amelia Bedelia finds a stray kitten and tries, in her literal-minded way, to take good care of it.

Watt, Melanie. Chester. A self-centered cat named Chester keeps interrupting his owner as she tries to write a story about a mouse.

Weeks, Sarah. Mac and Cheese. Two cats that are as different as night and day are nevertheless best friends.

Willems, Mo. City Dog, Country Frog. When City Dog comes to the country, he meets Country Frog for the first time, and every season afterward, the two have fun playing together.

Willems, Mo. The Pigeon Wants a Puppy! The pigeon really, really wants a puppy, but when a puppy arrives the pigeon changes its mind.

Wolff, Ashley. When Lucy Goes Out Walking: a puppy's first year. A curious puppy enjoys an adventure in each month of her first year.

Yates, Louise. Dog Loves Books. Dog loves books so much that he decides to open a book store.

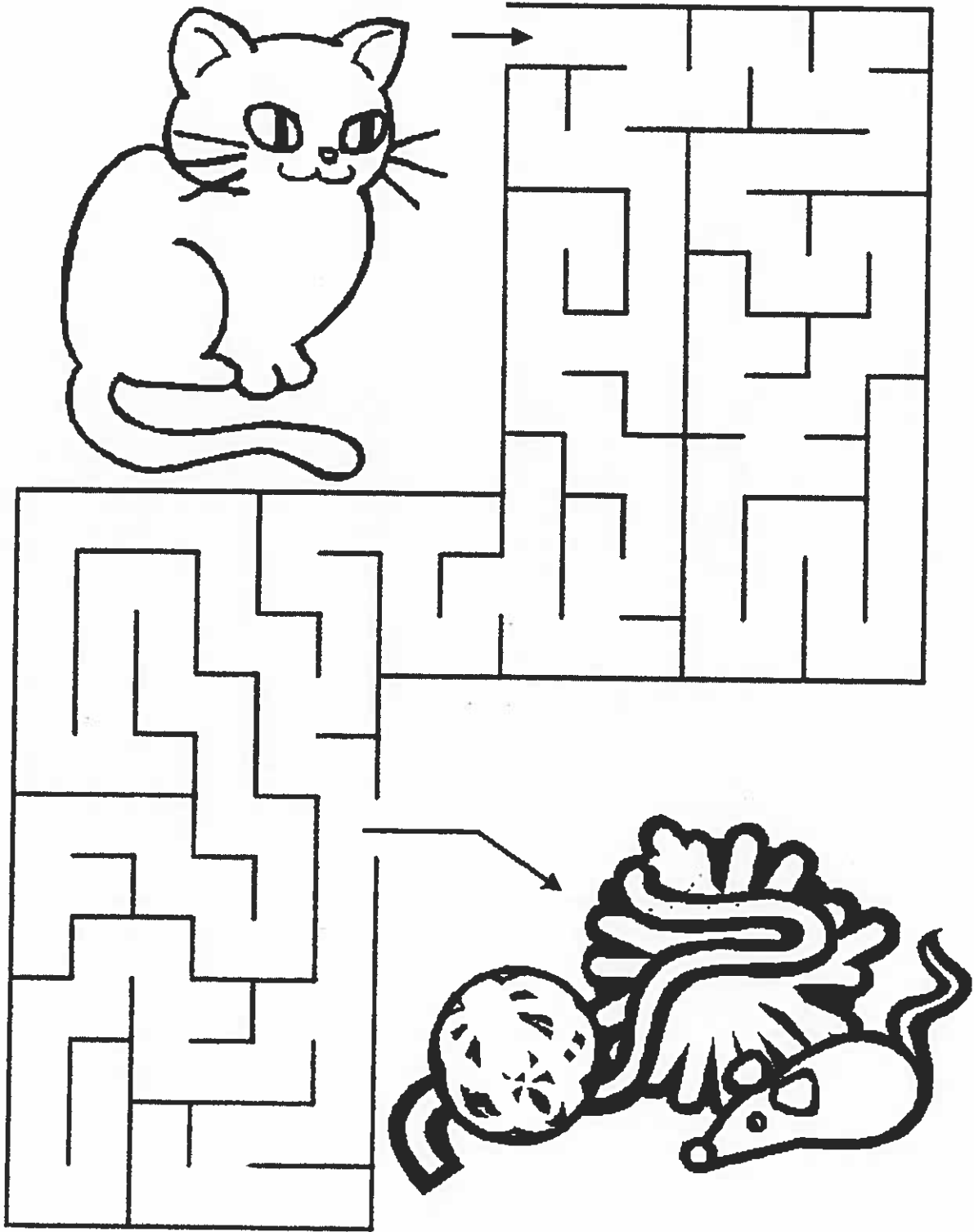

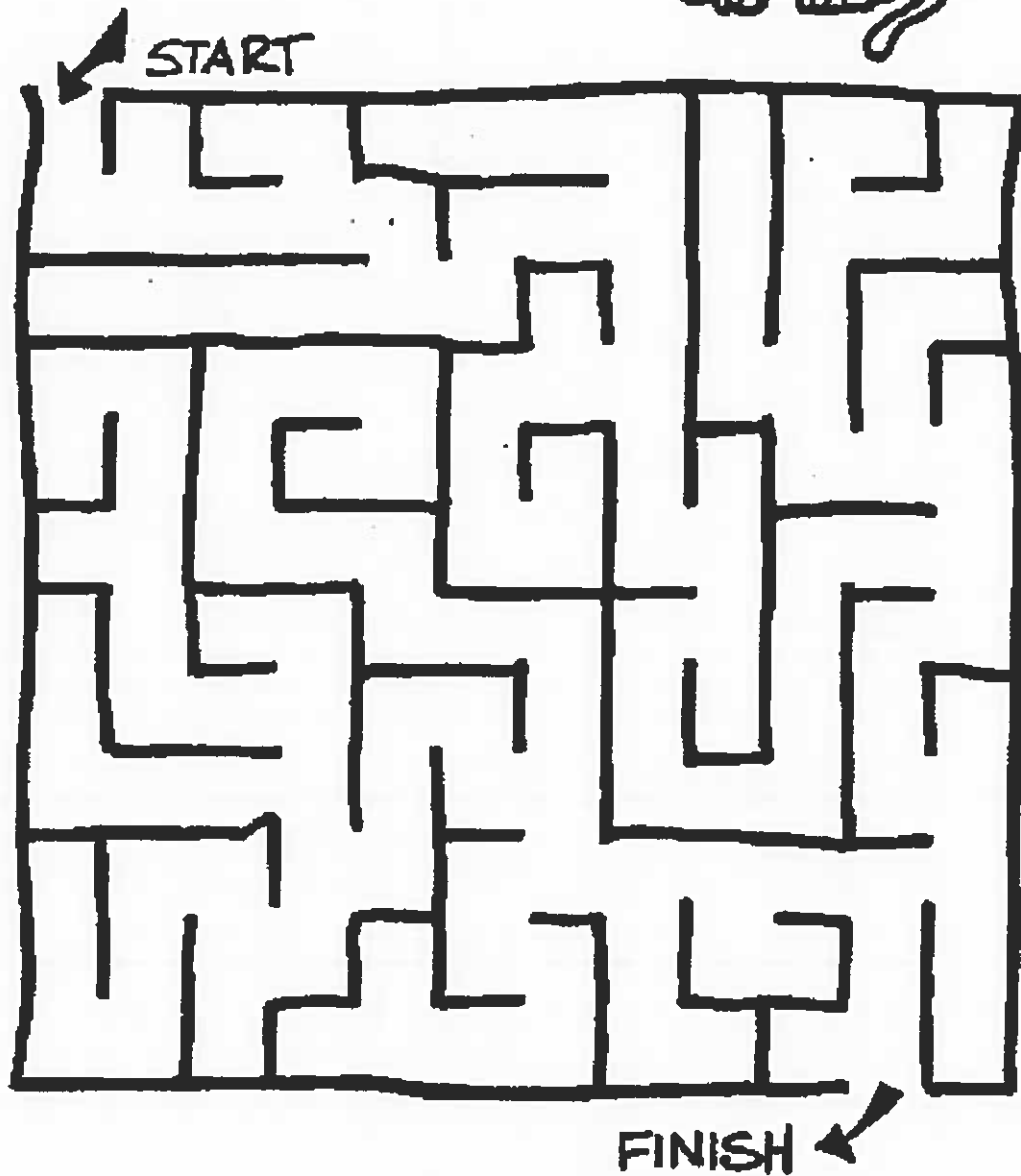

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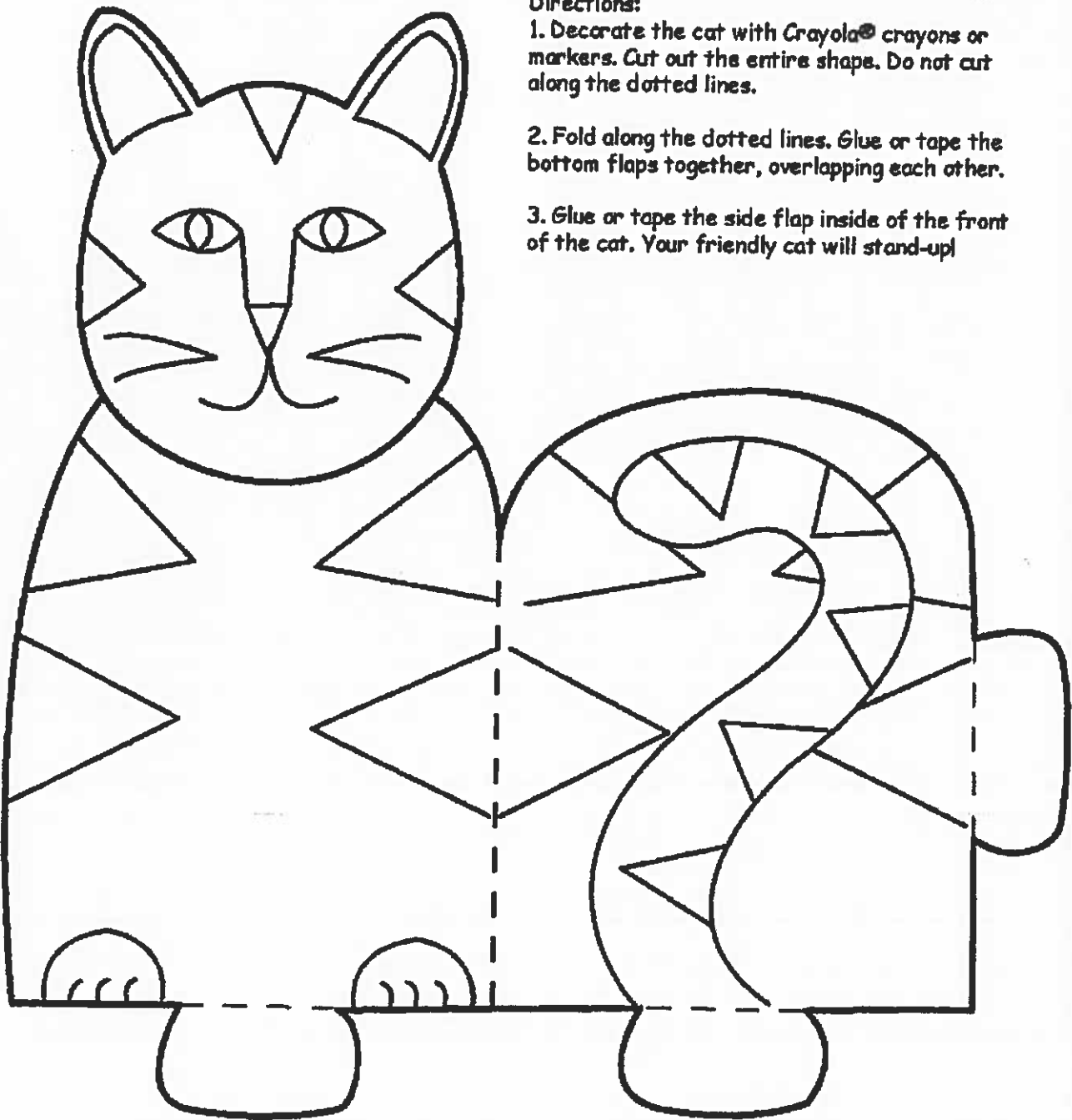
Friendly Cat

3. Glue or tape the side flap inside of the front of the cat. Your friendly cat will stand-up!

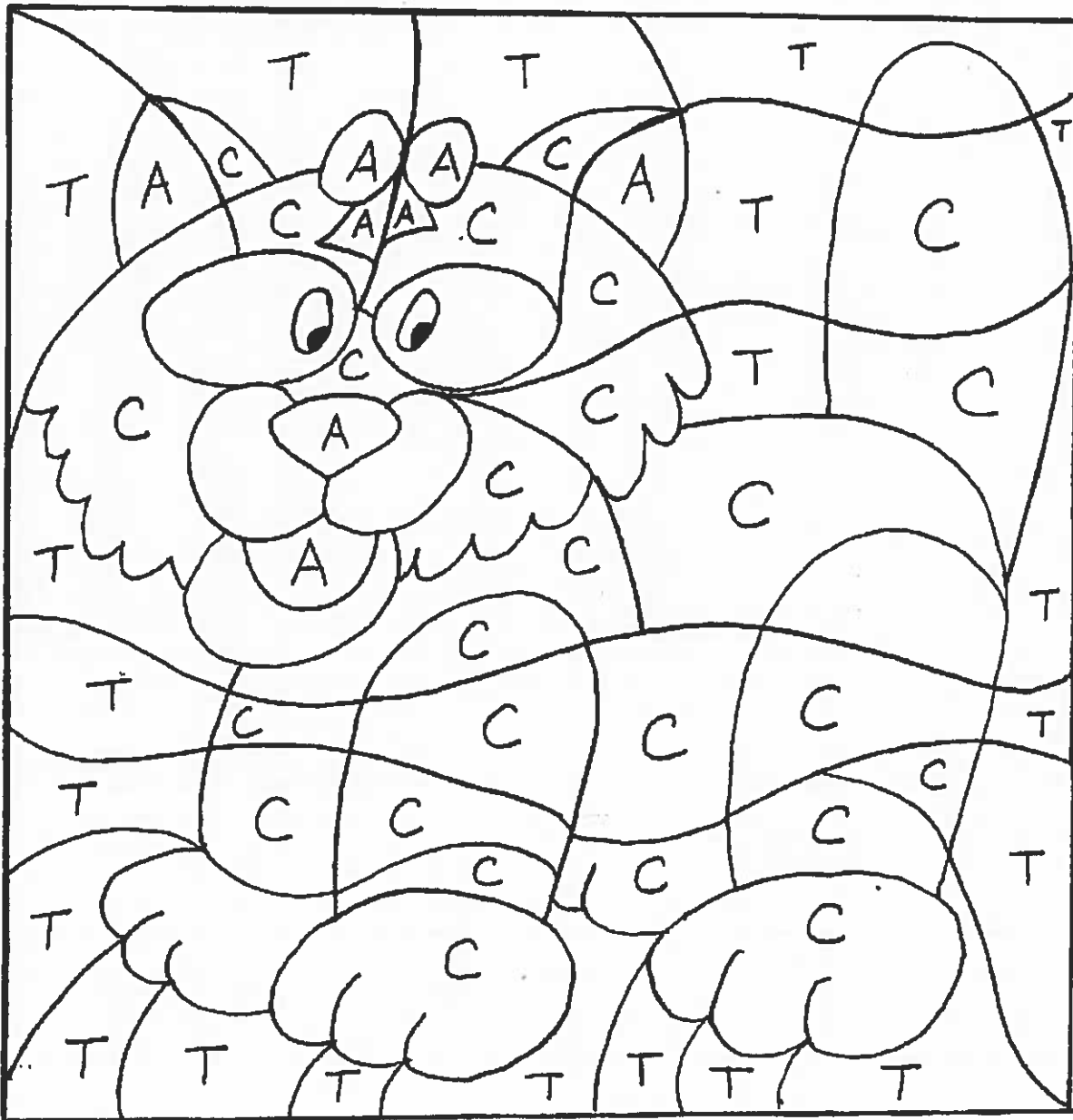


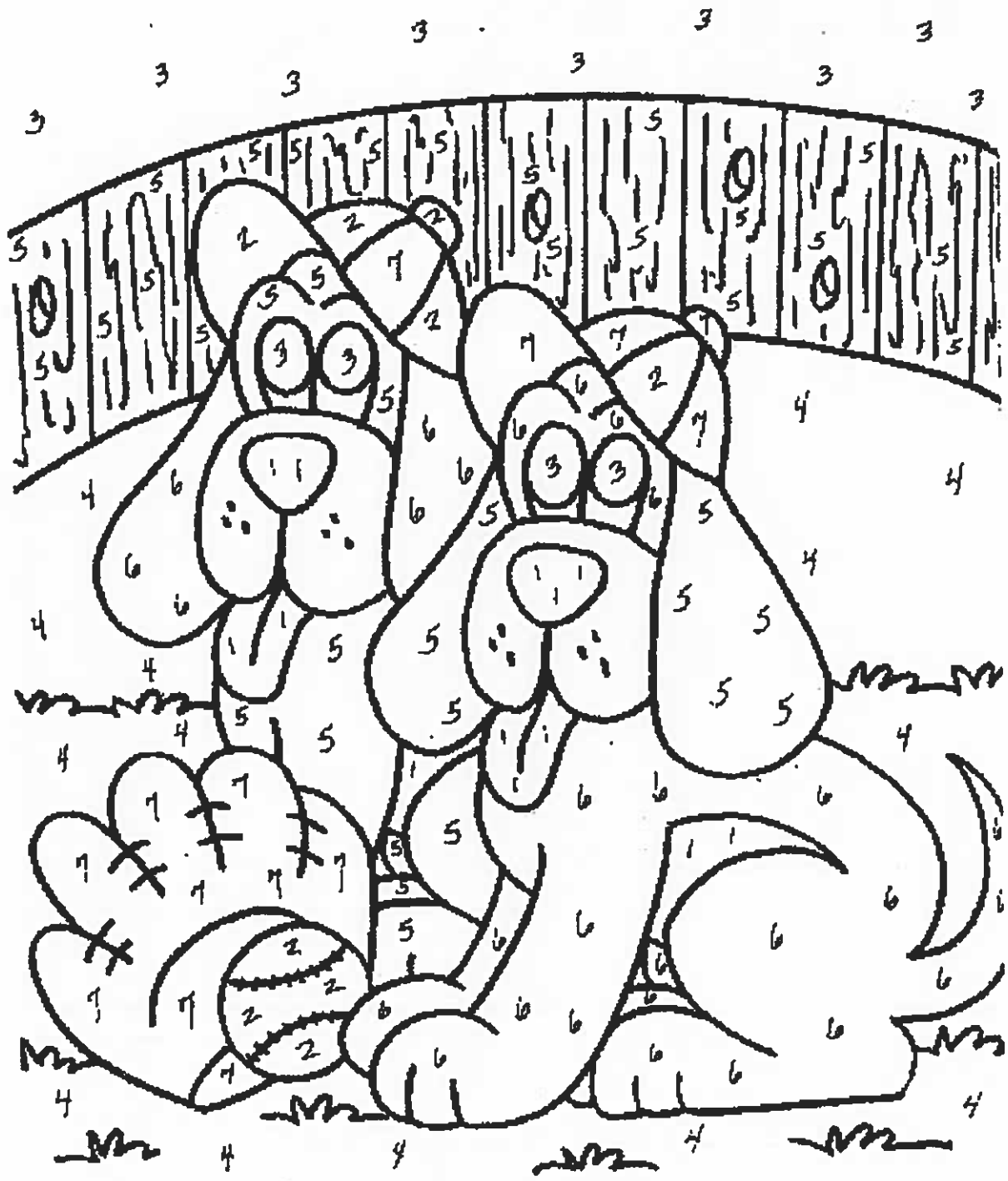
