Syllables - All words are made up of parts called syllables. Each syllable is one push of breath. To read or spell longer words you have to look at one syllable at a time.

Dividing Syllables

When a word has two consonants between the vowels, you divide between the consonants.

Example: mas cot

If there is only one consonant between the vowels, the first syllable must be closed.

Example: hab it

If the vowels are separated by a digraph, the digraph always stays together. It goes with the first syllable to keep it closed.

Example: jack et

If there are more than two consonants between the vowels, we usually pull over only one consonant to close the first syllable.

Example: chil dren

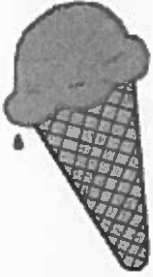

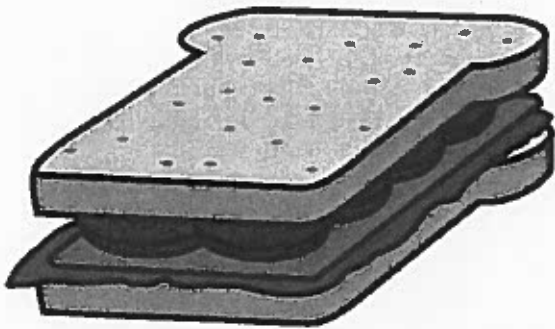
