6th Grade

Comparison Essay

Jack London used his literary skill to show the injustices done to Buck by comparing and contrasting his wonderful life before he was kidnapped and what happened to him after he was taken by Manuel. Write an essay comparing and contrasting the two different lives Buck was forced to lead.

The essay should follow this form.

- Begin by identifying the two environments being compared. Establish a purpose for the comparison.
- Establish the distinct nature of the two environments. Discuss the similarities and differences citing examples to support each statement.
- Conclude by summarizing the comparison.
- Essay typed in New Times Roman 14 pt. font and double spaced.
