Ada Deer

A native of Wisconsin's Menominee Reservation, Ada Deer is known as a "social work pioneer." A community organizer, activist, and political leader, she was the first American Indian to obtain a master of social work at Columbia University, the first woman to chair her tribe in Wisconsin, and the first American Indian woman to head the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs. Ada has worked to preserve the dignity of American Indians and indigenous peoples everywhere. Desiring to end "the loss of human potential," she has encouraged American Indians to maintain their dignity by promoting their causes, becoming educated, and serving as leaders.
