20 HOURS OF SERVICE ARE REQUIRED

The Breakfast Run This has become a great tradition at Saints John and Paul Parish. The students meet at 7am on a Sunday morning and prepare food that is donated by their families. We also collect warm clothing, socks and trial sized toiletries. We then take everything into Manhattan to a location on the West Side where needy people (selected by the Midnight Run Organization) are served a hot and cold breakfast by our students. Parents drive and supervise. It is a wonderful experience in “hands on” Christian Charity. The candidates earn five hours for this service.

Summer volunteers are needed (families are welcome!) at the following times: Tuesday morning (unloading a truck)—9:30 AM – 10:30 AM; Tuesday night (packing groceries)—6:30 PM – 7:30 PM; Wednesday mornings (delivery of groceries to homebound) 9:30 AM – 1-:30 AM.

HOPE Community Services, New Rochelle

HOPE serves dinner every Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday for over 100 guests. Parents can organize families to contribute to a dinner. Each family would make an entrée or salad or dessert at home and then transports it to Hope. For example, several families could make trays of pasta, others could procure salad ingredients and other could make a dessert.

Trinity St. Paul Brown Bag Lunch: Lunches for 150 guests are prepared every day of the week. We support them by collecting donation of bread from stop and Shop in Larchmont. We also make 150 lunches once per month. Religious Education students do this during class time.
