The Immortalists by Chloe Benjamin

What if you knew the date of your death? A psychic on New York's Lower East Side in 1969 claims to have the answer to this question, and four adolescents sneak out to hear their fortunes. Her revelations will impact their lives for decades.

The Black Painting by Neil Olson

A family patriarch has died suspiciously, his face turned toward the blank spot on the wall where his prized Goya painting — stolen years ago and never found — once hung. As the family gathers after the death, long-hidden secrets are uncovered.
