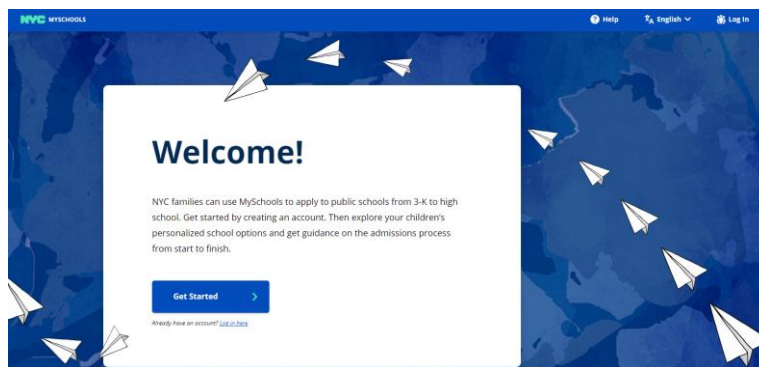




Applying To University Heights High School Fall 2019

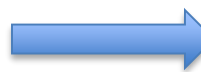


To log in and complete your high school application, parents/guardians will require:

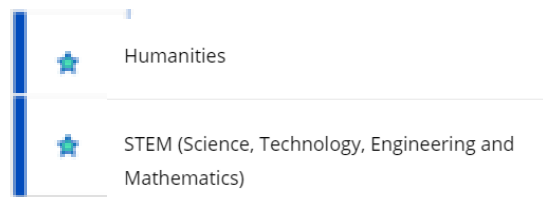
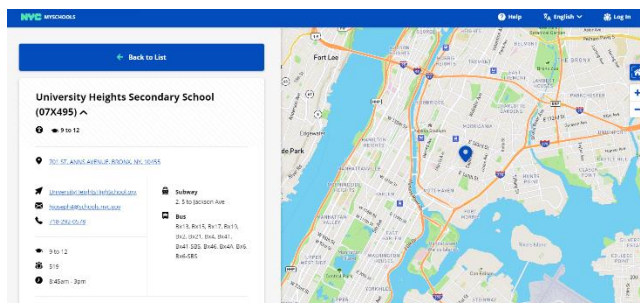
1. An email address.
2. The student's **Welcome Letter** mailed to your home from the Office of Student Enrollment. If this was not received, you may request it from the student's school counselor. The Welcome Letter contains an **account creation code** ("PIN code") that is required to log into the MySchools.

You can select up to 12 choices. University Heights High School has two programs that you are able to select. You may apply to **both** programs.

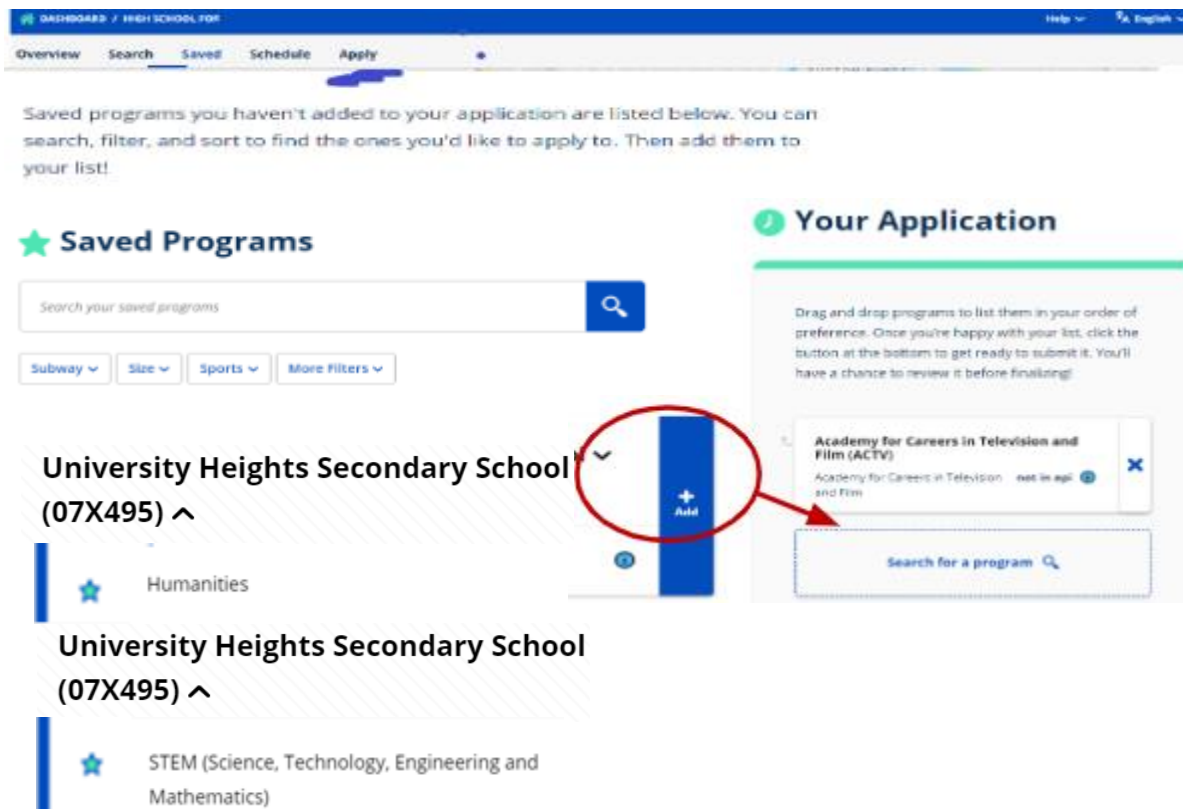

FAQs

What does it mean that University Heights High School is a “screened” school?

SCREENED

- Rank students using seventh grade core course grades, attendance, and state test scores.
- Group interview and computerized writing sample/critical thinking assessment.

How do I schedule my interview? How do I submit my child's writing sample?

Qualifying applicants will be invited for a level II assessment in December or January. At this scheduled time, the student applicant will participate in an hour-long group interview and an hour-long computerized critical thinking assessment (writing sample). This invitation will be mailed to the address provided in the MySchools application. If you have questions regarding your level II appointment, you can call our parent coordinator Esmeralda Pelaez at 718-292-0578, ext. 2042.

If my child is not placed in University Heights High School following round 1, what can I do next to continue seeking admission to UHHS?

If there are seats still available in round 2, you may again select 07X495 in your MySchools application. The same application process is available the following fall as well for our 10th grade Humanities program through MySchools.
