Mr. Dent updated the Board and the public on the referendum project. He noted that the boilers have been disconnected and the new ones have been placed and now need to be connected. BOARD OF EDUCATION OF MEDFORD LAKES RESOLUTION 2018-27

OBJECTION TO THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY'S FUNDING FORMULA FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education has approved the District Budget for the 2018-2019 school year, and recognizes that the budget incorporates a significant number of sacrifices, including constraints that impact technology, curriculum, and facilities, as well as a reduction in force that impacts the staff of the District, whether by assigning staff members to new responsibilities, or by reducing hours, or by eliminating certain positions altogether;

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education understands and fully supports the need for the District to provide a thorough and efficient education to ALL STUDENTS, per State and Federal law, while at the same time expressing disagreement with unfunded and under-funded mandates from the State and Federal governments, particularly in regard to providing services to students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), providing English as a Second Language (ESL) services to students categorized as English Language Learners (ELLs), or any other State-mandated and Federally-mandated services -- all without adequate State and Federal funding;

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education ensures that the District does indeed provide the aforementioned thorough and efficient education to ALL STUDENTS, per State and Federal law, including necessary services for students with special needs as mentioned above -- despite inequities in the State of New Jersey's funding formula for public education as well as inadequate funding from the State and Federal governments;

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education believes it is important to clarify that State and Federal mandates, when not fully funded by the State and Federal governments, are paid for by the local tax levy, thus causing Medford Lakes residents to bear the financial burden for these mandates;

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education is fully aware that the State of New Jersey, as a result of the Abbott v. Burke decisions (1985, 1990, et al.) and now under the New Jersey Schools Development Authority since 2007, provides ample funding to the thirty-one former "Abbott Districts," such that the students in those districts benefit from programs, services, and resources that are equal to, and sometimes greater than, those provided in the wealthiest districts in the State;

WHEREAS the Medford Lakes Board of Education recognizes that while Medford Lakes is not a former "Abbott District," nor has Medford Lakes ever benefited from the Abbott v. Burke decisions, the needs of our students -- regardless of socioeconomic status, ethnicity, country of origin, innate abilities, or any other factor that can be considered -- are just as important as the needs of students in Camden, Newark, Paterson, Pemberton, and all other former "Abbott Districts" throughout the State of New Jersey;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Medford Lakes Board of Education stands in solidarity to express its vehement objection to State of New Jersey's funding formula for public education as well as the unfunded and under-funded mandates imposed on Medford Lakes and other public school districts that do not reap the benefits of the Abbott v. Burke decisions, but rather strive each and every day to "do more with less," amid a swelling tide of complex and costly requirements, while being informed on an annual basis that our State and Federal funding will not see a substantial increase;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Medford Lakes Board of Education is steadfast in its mission, that regardless of this serious lapse in financial and educational equity, and regardless of the fact that these significant issues remain unresolved by governing bodies at the State and Federal levels, the Medford Lakes School District is fully committed to providing a thorough and efficient education to ALL STUDENTS in Medford Lakes, per State and Federal law and, more importantly, per the beliefs and values of the Medford Lakes community.
