

*Consistency and routine are more important than ever, so families are strongly encouraged to be fully remote or fully in-person to the greatest degree possible. We also recognize and respect how complex this situation is, and that the many factors involved with remote and in-person instruction change over time. **We're here to support you.***

Remote Learning Overview

- Every child will be assigned to an elementary homeroom or a middle school section, just as before.
- Class attendance throughout the entire school day is mandatory, just as would be the case if a child was physically in the building. Schoolwide attendance will be taken every day by 8:30, just as before, and period-by-period attendance will be taken as well.
- Classroom norms and expectations for conduct, participation, and etiquette fully apply to the home environment. They'll be established as a class and school for everyone to follow and shared with parents/caregivers so they can support at home.
- Assignments and activities are to be completed by students learning remotely on the same timeline as the students in the building. Exceptions can be made at a teacher's discretion for any students on a situational basis.
- Children will connect to their classrooms through Microsoft Teams, initially muted but with video and sound on, so the child and teacher can see each other and the child can hear the teacher.
- Opportunities to interact directly with the teachers and classmates will be available when feasible, though the level of involvement may not be the same as if it were in-person.
- Teacher screens will be shared when appropriate so students learning remotely can see what the teacher is displaying on the TruTouch, for example.
- All students will have access to available digital resources posted in Teams for all classmates.
- Students needing additional specialized (RTI, Special Ed) academic support or counseling will receive it.
- An additional Teacher or Teacher's Asst. will be assigned to reach out to remote students periodically over the course of each cycle.
- Students will be graded the same as their peers and receive report cards, though assessments given remotely may look different due to the nature of the testing environment.
