Choose a nonfiction text on a topic of interest and write the main idea and 3 supporting details.	Collect some rocks. Sort the rocks based on the following physical properties: • color • texture	Create a picture book that could be used by younger students to explain how kids can be a helpful part of their community.	<b>Art</b> Draw and color using whatever materials found in your home to make a picture of yourself doing your favorite spring or summer activity.
Draw the outline of a room in your house. Find the perimeter of the room. If you don't have a tool to measure with, you can use sheets of paper.	Retell a story that you have read but change the ending so the story has a new ending.	Make a list of animals you find outside in your area. What animal adaptations are needed to survive?	Create a timeline of your life that includes 5 key dates and descriptions.	<b>Music</b> Sing two songs that you learned in music class for your parents or a friend.
Design and create a game using multiplication. Include the game rules, question cards, and an answer key. Be creative. Play your game with family members. Hold the paper up to a mirror and record your observations. Try writing the same word again so that you can read it correctly when you hold it up to the mirror again.	Pick a current event topic to read about in print or online at: <a href="https://www.timeforkids.com/g34/">https://www.timeforkids.com/g34/</a> Write 2-3 sentences explaining what you learned or found interesting.	<b>Media</b> Design a bookmark for your favorite book to read.
Practice telling time to the minute throughout the day. Create time word problems with addition and subtraction and work with family members to solve them.	Have someone read to you for 10 minutes OR visit <a href="https://www.storylineonline.net/">https://www.storylineonline.net/</a> and choose a book to be read aloud to you. Write the title and 2 sentences about the text.	Plants have different parts to them. The roots absorb nutrients, the stems provide support, the leaves make food, and flowers attract pollinators/produce seeds for reproduction. Find a plant to observe/draw and label the parts.	Many things can make up a person's culture: food, language, clothing, tools, music, traditions, beliefs, and religion. Pick a photo/object that represents your culture and write 2-3 sentences explaining it. Share with a family member or caregiver.	<b>Performing Arts</b> Read aloud a favorite book using different voices.
