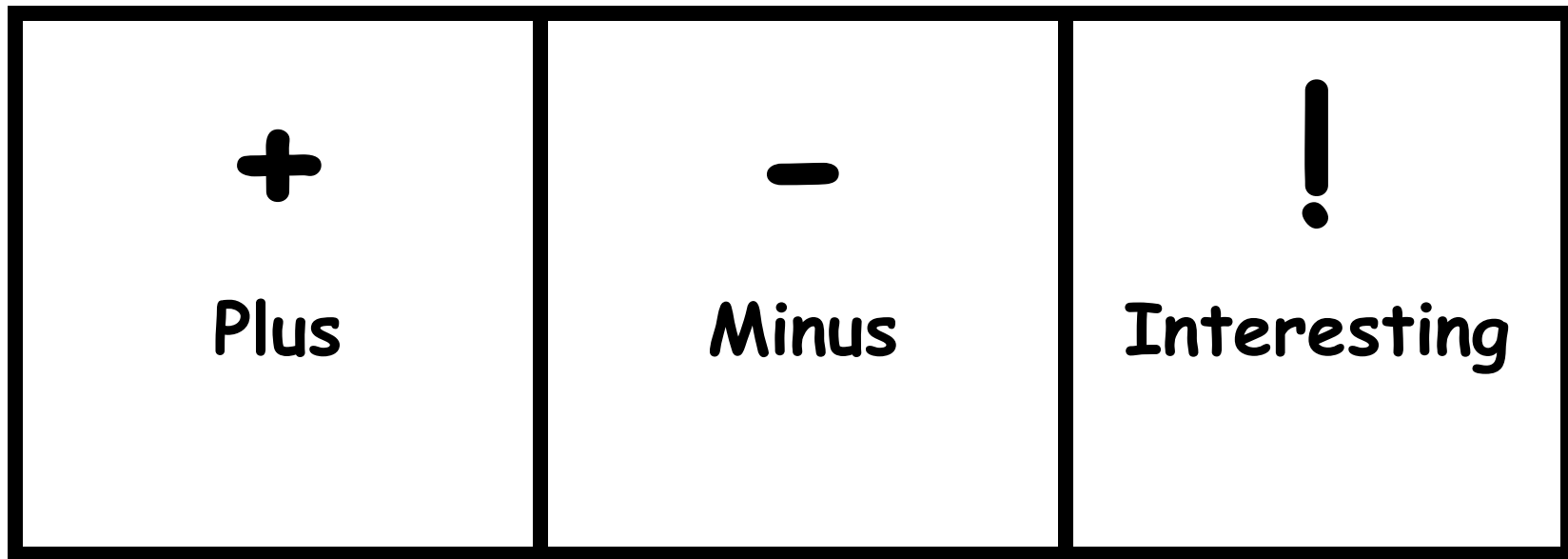


VS.9b and c Harry F. Byrd.

# Harry F. Byrd



**Teacher Tips:** Make a hot dog fold with a 1" tab uncovered along the side. Cut the overlapping section to make 3 flaps. Glue the title "Harry F. Byrd" in the 1" tab. Glue the plus, minus, interesting (PMI) rectangles on the flaps, one per section. Lead a class discussing and brainstorm what might fit in each section. Write these facts under the flaps. Or, have students glue the corresponding facts listed below underneath the flaps. For details and facts about Harry F. Byrd, refer to the *Curriculum Framework*, pages 38-39. Have students draw pictures to show the meaning of each underneath the top flaps.

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He was governor of Virginia. He was known for his "pay as you go" policy to improve roads. Harry Byrd modernized state government.

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In response to The Supreme Court ruling in Brown vs. the Board of Education, he established a policy of Massive Resistance. This delayed integration in Virginia's schools.

He was publisher of the *Winchester Star* newspaper.

Harry Byrd had apple and peach orchards.
