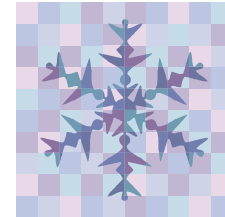

Teaching Tips: Make a hot dog fold with a 1" tab uncovered along the side. Cut the overlapping section to make 4 flaps. Glue the title in the 2" tab. Glue the 4 seasons on flaps, one per section. Students write how the Indians adapted under each flap, adding details or add drawings to describe each weakness.
