Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00pm

GOOD FRIDAY – April 19th at 3:00pm & 7:00pm – Celebration of the Lord's Passion & Death

This is a day of Fast and Abstinence.

HOLY SATURDAY – April 20th at 7:30pm – Easter Vigil Mass

(NO 4:00pm (St. Agnes) or 5:30pm (St. Patrick) Masses allowed.

EASTER SUNDAY – April 21st at 8:00am & 10:00am at St. Agnes and 11:30am at St. Patrick's

(NO 5:30pm Mass at St. Agnes)
