The PSAT/NMSQT will be available to be taken at Pearl River HS on October 19TH, 2019. If you are interested in taking this exam you MUST register by bringing \$30 (CASH OR CHECK MADE PAYABLE TO PEARL RIVER HIGH SCHOOL) to the Guidance Department between Sept. 27th -Oct. 11th. Please be aware there is a limited number of tests available and will be provided on a first-come first-serve basis, based upon date of registration.

If you are registered to take an SAT or Subject Test on Saturday, OCTOBER 5TH at Pearl River High School please pay close attention to the following reminders:

1. Plan to arrive to PRHS at 7:45 a.m. and enter through the 3rd floor entrance by the flagpole.
2. Bring your admission ticket, acceptable photo identification, acceptable calculator, and sharpened #2 pencils. If you plan to use your school I.D. card as a form of photo identification, please be sure it for the **2018-2019 OR 2019-2020 school year ONLY**.
3. Snacks and drinks are permitted during scheduled breaks only.

All cell phones and electronics that are brought to the test center will be collected for the entire exam. Failure to turn your device in can result in your score being cancelled.

Reminders:

5163 HIGH SCHOOL LUNCH PERIODS To maintain student focus during the school day on educational program activities, high school students shall be required to eat lunch at school and remain on the school campus during their lunch period with the exception of seniors, who shall enjoy the privilege of walking off school grounds for lunch. Students who drive cars to school, regardless of where they park, are prohibited from using their cars during the hours of the school day, unless they are in possession of a school approved dismissal pass issued by the Building Principal, based upon a written application by the student's parent, legal guardian or the student's own note where the student is an emancipated minor or has reached the age of 21.

Electronic devices: Cell phones and other electronic devices need to be off and away the entire day.

Lateness to school as a reminder, students must bring in a parent note to the attendance office within 48 hours if they are late to school. Students who are late without a note serve an afterschool detention after the 48 hours.

Safety: Students are not to climb the fence between the high school and Shop Rite at any time. Anyone wishing to exit the campus on the Shop Rite side of the building must go out the exit on Central Avenue. Climbing the fence may cause personal injury and damage to the Shop Rite property.
