Course Description: In ESL 4, students will continue to practice interpersonal communication and academic language skills. By the end of the semester, our goal is for students to be more comfortable speaking, listening, reading, and writing in English. The theme for this class will center on modern world history from 1750 to present, which will complement content taught in Global 4. The class will be divided by marking period with three overarching themes: Nationalism, Globalization, and Human Rights. By the end of the semester, students will be prepared to enter English 5. Students will complete individual and group projects, written exams, and multiple quizzes each marking period.

Topics/Aims Covered:

1st Marking Period: Nationalism
2nd Marking Period: Globalization
3rd Marking Period: Human Rights

Course Objectives: By the end of term, students will be able to:

- Write and speak in complex and expanding sentences using a variety of verb tenses
- Read and comprehend texts in English, including historical documents and related articles
- Form and express an opinion with supporting evidence in writing and speaking
- Further develop skills in literary elements such as tone, word choice, symbolism, figurative language, connotations, idioms, and point of view
- Write 4+ paragraph narrative, expository, and persuasive essays

Texts / Resources / Materials Needed: Every student needs a binder for the class. This may be left in the classroom at the student's own risk. Students must show up with sufficient paper for assignments and a pen or pencil. Students are recommended to purchase a highlighter.

Requirements for Successfully Completing this Course:

- Cell phone policy – Cell phones are only to be used for translation when explicitly permitted from the teacher. Cell phones used for any other purpose (such as texting, Snapchat, Instagram) will be confiscated and returned at the end of class.
- Lateness policy – It is important for all students to arrive on time. Late students will sign in at the Late Log by the door and will be marked as late on the formal attendance. Being late 2 times will equal 1 absence in the gradebook.
- Restroom policy – As per school policy, students may not go to the restroom in the first or last 10 minutes of class. Students will be given 4 Bathroom Passes to use at their discretion each marking period. Unused bathroom passes can be turned in at the end of the marking period for extra credit.

Grading Policy and Marking Periods:

Grades are evaluative and descriptive tools that help communicate what students have learned. Determinations of passing or failing must be based primarily on how well students master the subject matter, concepts, content, and skills addressed in a class or course. Students cannot pass or fail primarily based on non-mastery measures.

Every student begins the course with 100%. It is your job to keep it there by attending class, participating, completing assignments on time, and studying for tests.

To receive credit for this course, students must also pass English 4 (Power Writing). This is in accordance to CR Part 154.
