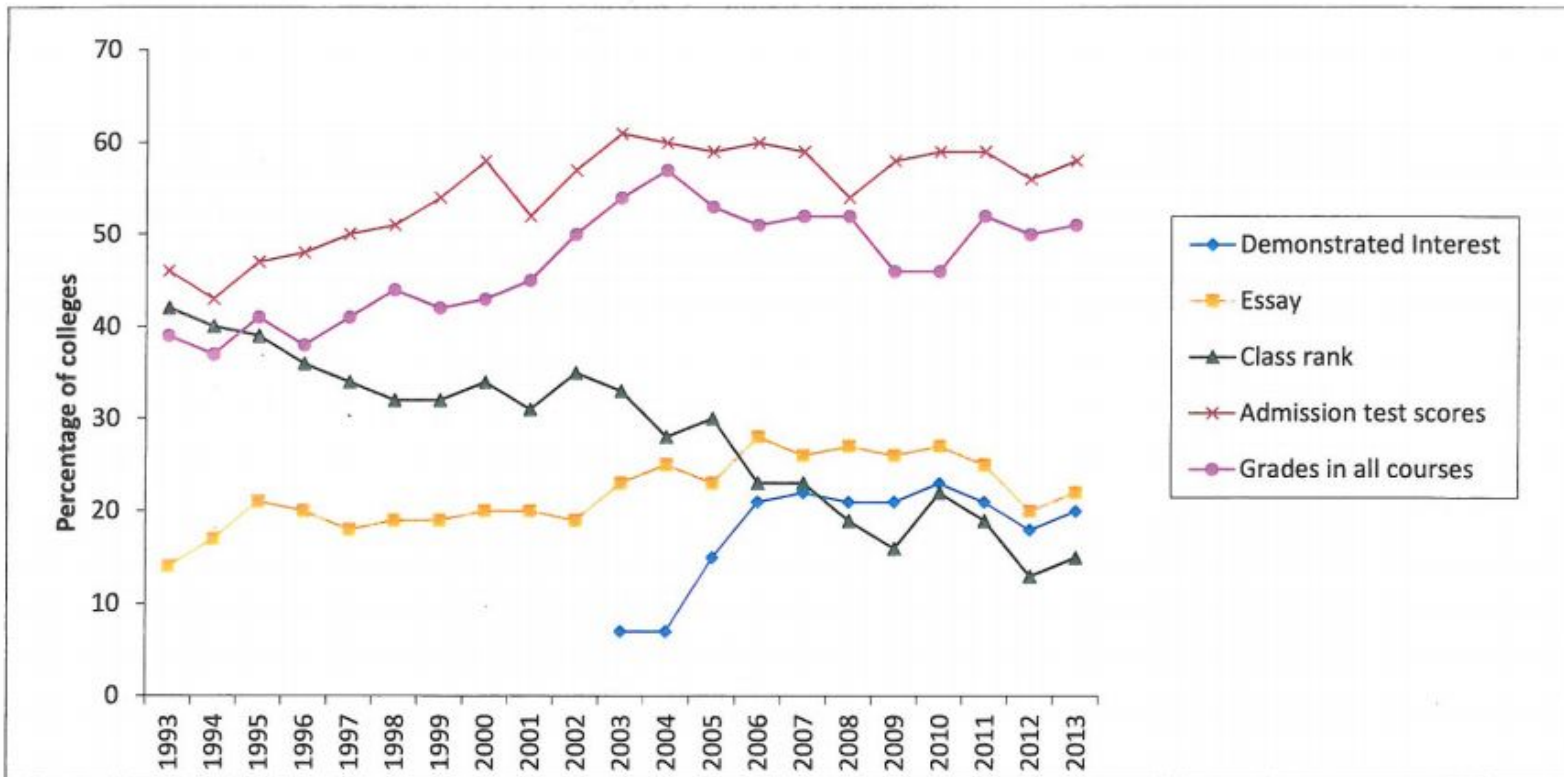

- What is the average class size?
- Is there a core curriculum?
- What are the required courses for my major?
- When do I have to declare a major?
- Do faculty have office hours? |
- Are there minors offered?
- What support services are available?
- What kinds of honors course/programs are offered?
- Do you offer internship opportunities and are they paid?
- What types of career planning and placement services are available?

## **ON STUDENT LIFE**

- What types of housing accommodations do you offer?
- Is there guaranteed housing for all students?
- What is it like to live in a residence hall?
- What is the campus like on weekends?
- Are fraternities and sororities popular?
- Are there intramural sports?
- What are the various student clubs and organizations?
- Do you have campus publications?
- How can I become involved in campus activities?
