CAFETERIA RULES

- 1) Students must enter the cafeteria in an orderly fashion and go immediately to their class tables. If late, a late pass is required.
- 2) **ALL STUDENTS MUST SIT AT THEIR CLASS TABLE!**
- 3) Silence is required at the signal. Lunch will not begin unless the cafeteria leader has your complete attention.
- 4) Students must be respectful of all adults and students (including school aides, teachers, paraprofessionals, lunchroom staff, Assistant Principals, the Principal, the Dean, and other students.) **Students may not curse, talk back, or use any objectionable language.**
- 5) Students may line up for purchases **only after their class has been called.**
- 6) Students **may not throw food** of any kind, or any other objects, in the cafeteria.
- 7) Students **may not leave the cafeteria** without a pass, (for monitoring, detention, tutoring, etc.)
- 8) Classes will be permitted out of the cafeteria **only after all classes have been called** for food, and the individual class's table top and floor are clean and free of garbage.
- 9) Students **must leave the cafeteria when instructed** (at least 7 minutes before the end of the period.)
- 10) Students **may not bounce or throw balls of any kind** anywhere in or around school, except for in the school yard. (Only basketballs or handballs are permitted and **must be in a bag**. Footballs, soccer balls, and baseballs are not permitted.)
- 11) **Running is not permitted** in or around school, except for in the school yard.
- 12) When in the auditorium in inclement weather, students must take a seat and remain in their seats; no switching seats and no saving seats.
- 13) Students must return to the building when the whistle blows, without having to be personally invited or reminded.

POSSIBLE CONSEQUENCES FOR BREAKING THE RULES

- A) Detention table (If student is instructed to remain at the detention table and does not, he/she will be referred to the Dean and/or Assistant Principal.)
 - B) Students who leave a mess will be required to clean up.
 - C) Referral to Assistant Principal or Dean (after 2 or 3 infractions,) who will follow up with phone calls home.
 - D) Removal from grade trips (AP's final decision with input from aides, teachers, and Dean.)
