Dear Clark Schools Parents/Guardians:

I hope that this letter finds you and your families doing well. Due to the rising number of positive COVID-19 cases in our community and state along with the travel both outside of and into our homes that is so very often associated with the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, the decision to close our schools for in-person learning from Monday, November 30 through Friday, December 4 has been made. During this remote learning week, our students will be participating in four-hour days. While the start and end times of these four-hour days by school are given below, more specific building-based information will be sent from each school.

CHK and VRS will remain closed to in-person students and continue to operate under their current a.m./p.m. full remote schedules next Monday (the 23rd) and Tuesday (the 24th). Wednesday, November 25 was already a scheduled full remote, a.m. session only day for all of our schools.

If your family is in need of a device during this full remote learning time, please email remotelarning@clarkschools.org in order to arrange a pickup time. Your child's name, school, and grade will need to be included within the email.

Kindly remember to follow Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and State guidelines regarding travel and visitors. Please know that, while our intent at this time is to return to our current a.m./p.m. sessions for the remainder of December, the Board of Education, administrators, and I are diligently working to prepare for a four-hour in-person day to begin in the new calendar year pending the needed health and safety clearance can be met. We will be providing you with updates when doing so is possible.
