We have a teacher from outside the building going to teach Chess for the afterschool program.

The zoo will start as soon as we get back from vacation in January.

Open Agenda

Ms. Ortega suggested maybe having ECHO- Emergency Children's Help Organization coming to one of our SLT meetings. ECHO is designed to help families on Staten Island who are in distress whether it being financial, health or anything else families may need help with. Echo's goal is to get the word out about them for Staten Island families.

We are doing a Pilot program for reading intervention. The program will be on the computers this will be for grades three, four and five. We will try to get licenses for all these students, if we do not then the licenses we get will be used for targeted students.

Another pilot program is HMH this is science dimension for all students' grades 3 through 5, this will be hands on experiments. This was given to us for free.

Mr. Ihne was given a total of 195,000 dollars RESO A he will use this money to purchase iPads for the school. The iPads will not be available until June.
