

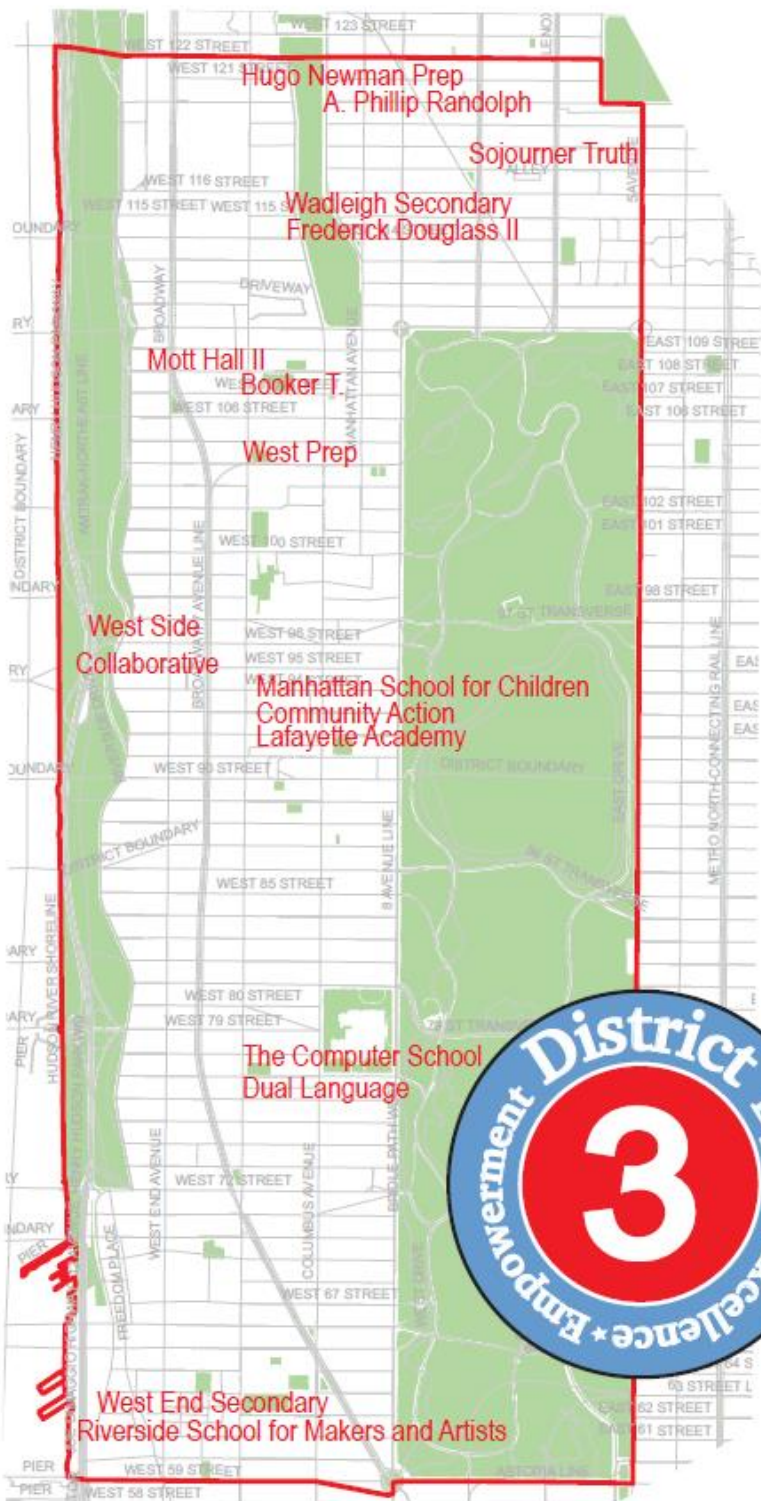

Highlights:

West Prep offers a class called Titan Studio during the day for students to explore the arts, participate in team competitions, and learn about future careers. In our Titan Studio program students can choose from a diverse menu of courses that include activities such as lego robotics, coding, yoga, debate, chess, meditation, step team, and even a service learning class that culminates in an international trip to Costa Rica! These studio classes meet weekly, are taught by teaching artists as well as classroom teachers, and end with two performance showcases in the winter and spring to share what we have learned with our families.

Curriculum:

ELA: Expeditionary Learning, plus an additional independent reading period tailored to students' individual needs.

Social Studies: Passport, with an emphasis on nonfiction reading and evidence-based writing.

Math: Pearson enVision Math 2.0

Science: Standards-based; Urban Advantage-supported. All 8th graders take the NYS Living Environment Regents Exam.

Accelerated Programs:

West Prep offers accelerated classes in math, foreign language, and science. All 8th graders have access to Living Environment, Algebra, and Spanish courses. This gives them the opportunity to earn up to 4 high school credits before graduating middle school. 7th and 8th grade scholars are offered free SHSAT test prep after school. Students also take the exam at West Prep during the school day as opposed to weekend testing off site.

Targeted Supports:

The following supports are tailored to each student throughout the day based on their academic, social, or emotional needs: Strategic math groupings, strategic reading programs, Yale Ruler approach to Social Emotional Learning, restorative circles, advisory, College Access for all, free test prep for the SHSAT after school, small group tutoring after school with classroom teachers.

Enrichment Programs:

West Prep offers a robust elective program that includes technology, physical activity, performing arts, visual arts, and Marching Band. Our sequential music program is one of the many things that make the school stand out in our district. When students graduate from WPA they are able to play several musical instruments from our brass and percussion section. Students participate in two major showcase events each year that highlight our studio program, marching band, performing arts, and visual arts. We are proud to make a program that allows students to express their creativity while participating in a community that cherishes celebrations of talent.

West Prep students use technology as part of their everyday assignments and in their electives classes. Students learn coding through the Computer Science for all Program, and robotics using Lego E3 kits. West Prep is also a Google Apps for education school and has also adopted an online grading system through Jupitergrades.com

West Prep offers free after school programming everyday until 5:30PM through a partnership with WestHab.

ACE (Advanced Culinary Education): additional after school program offered to all 8th graders. In this program, students explore wellness through body and mind programs that include meditation, and culinary arts.

Super Scholars: honor roll program where students go on 4 all-expense paid trips throughout the year.

Highlights: Frederick Douglass Academy II Secondary School is a community of learners that encourages every scholar to be an active participant in their education. Fostering a safe, consistent environment, we celebrate each Scholar's individual identity and success. Through a rigorous curriculum, cultural enrichment opportunities and experiential learning, we prepare our Scholars to achieve academic and personal excellence As a result of our work FDA II was the #1 Middle School in 2017 for growth on the NYS Math Exam.	
Curriculum: Middle School Scholars engage with an interdisciplinary project based curriculum. Scholars take Humanities which is an integrated English and Social Studies course. For Mathematics, we use the Envision 2.0 math program. Scholars participate in a lab based Science program that prepares them to take the Living Environment Regents in Eighth grade. In addition, all Scholars participate in a STEM sequence in that includes courses in Engineering, Robotics and Computer Science. For the arts Scholars have a choice of Ceramics, Visual Arts, Theater and Band. Scholars participate in a daily advisory course called Community, where we focus on building healthy peer relationships, developing positive work habits and engage in independent reading. Our curriculum is augmented with frequent curriculum based trips.	
Accelerated Programs: We offer Accelerated Science and Math Program. Scholars take the Algebra and Living Environment Regents at the end of their 8th Grade year.	
Targeted Supports: Academic Support classes for Scholars are available during the regular school day, after school and on Saturdays. Highlights: Our School proudly boasts a culture of C.A.R.E. Our students are actively engaged in collaboration, arts & inquiry, and reflection. They are empowered in their education. This is done by creating a small, supportive environment, through weekly grade-level town hall meetings and our Crew Advisory program. All students are well known by staff and feel supported in the activities.

Accelerated Programs: At PS/IS 180, all students partake in an accelerated math and science curriculum. All 8 th grade students will be eligible to take the Living Environment and Algebra I Regents exams.

Our middle school math teachers, using targeted intervention strategies, periodic assessments and guided math games, coordinate this. All students participate in extended reading support with Book Club periods where they work on building reading stamina and their student discourse skills.	
Enrichment Programs: All middle school students at PS 180 participate in Genius Hour. These bi-weekly small group classes allow students to choose an area of interest to study. Teachers will facilitate the learning and guide students toward culminating products, presented in a round table forum. Students in grades 7 & 8 have student-choice electives. Students choose from a variety of elective class offerings each semester. This Fall students choose between, forensics, speech and debate, media and journalism and theater arts and set design. All middle school students are eligible for a free 5-day a week after school program with our partner Sports and Arts in Schools. Students can also join one of our many afterschool clubs and sports teams, including flag football, cheerleading, soccer, speech and debate, and basketball.	
Special Education Supports/Programs: PS/IS 180 offers ICT and SETTS supports for each grade in middle school. Students are also given intervention supports as needed to meet all special education requirements. Speech, OT and PT are also provided.

Highlights: Dual Language Middle School believes that bilingualism opens doors and seeks to provide students a rigorous education in a linguistically and culturally diverse community. In addition to high academic standards, we offer advisory and a rigorous, three-year course of study in both Dance and Visual Arts to all of our students. We are also proud of our partnerships with leading cultural institutions and organizations including the American Museum of Natural History, PENCIL, NBA Cares, Groundswell and Salesforce.	
Curriculum: Dual Language Middle School utilizes student learning needs, interests, and skills in alignment with content area standards to develop unique and engaging curricula in all content areas. Teachers utilize varied content-area resources and hands-on experiences in the classroom to ensure that student learning needs are addressed and nurtured through tailored instruction to meet individual student needs. Teachers also incorporate field trips and other activities to bring the curriculum to life and take advantage of the rich landscape of New York City.	
Accelerated Programs: All students participate in a three-year accelerated Spanish program which leads to high school course credit. Select 8 th grade students are invited to participate in a year-long course of advanced Algebra Regents coursework, which prepares students for the Regents Exam and leads to high school course credit. Select students are also invited to participate in advanced Computer Science and Art History courses.	
Targeted Supports: All students receive additional, small group instruction three times per week based upon their independent reading and/or math level to address and accelerate skills. Additionally, more than 75% of all classes are taught by two teachers. This ensures that targeted, differentiated, and rigorous instruction and learning take place consistently for all students.	
Enrichment Programs: During the school day, all students take Visual Arts, Dance and Physical Education. Additionally, all students at Dual Language Middle school are provided afterschool enrichment at no cost to families. Afterschool activities are facilitated by DLMS teachers and the programs include: Homework Help, Contemporary Dance Team, STEM Club, Art Club, Astronomy and more. Additional programs are available based upon student request and interest.	
Special Education Supports/Programs: Dual Language Middle School offers both Special Education Teacher Support Services and Integrated Co-Teaching models of Special Education instruction in all three grades. Additionally, many classes are co-taught by two teachers regardless of Special Education classification. Students also receive both mandated services and additional supports, including Speech/Language Therapy, Counseling and other services.

Highlights: West Side Collaborative provides the perfect transition between the nurturing elementary school environment and the challenge of high school. We meet students where they are in 6th grade and assess what they need to succeed academically and in terms of their social and emotional development after they graduate from middle school. We do this by tapping into cutting-edge research on the key aspects of adolescent development and learning, including cognitive, social, and emotional development as well as brain research on how adolescents learn. Our staff works collaboratively in teacher teams to share insights about student progress in different classes and on a variety of assignments. This collaborative team teaching assures that multiple educators are working to enable each student's success and to assure that no one falls through the cracks.
