Reading

In January we will be returning back to fiction books. This unit will focus on characters, the main idea, and the setting of a story. Students will still be encouraged to use the strategies they learned in previous reading units, such as look at all parts of the words and scooping up many words and phrases to make their voice sound smooth. Readers will focus on characters while making connections to people, real world events, and feelings. Partners will be working together to jot down information by readers in order for them to talk about characters in their story. Students will use inferencing strategies to closely notice characters' feelings and/or changes of feelings throughout the story and retelling strategies to hold the events of the story while using temporal words when sharing in their partnerships. At home you can ask your child questions about the characters in their books as they read and have your child retell the big events in their story when they are finished reading the book.

Writing

In writing, we are learning how to write just like authors we admire. In first grade we are focusing on narratives by writing small moments. We are continuing from September with vocabulary such as first, next, then, and last to show even order in our writing. Good writers think of an idea, touch & tell, sketch, and then write! Good writers go back and add details about their characters. Ask your child to share with you what they are learning in writing!

Math

During the month of January we will be working on Topic 4, using strategies to solve subtraction facts to 20. Students are encouraged to use math vocabulary while solving subtraction problems. The math vocabulary we will be using during this Topic are, difference, fact family, and related facts. Students will be asked to explain the strategies they use to solve subtraction problems. Please go over math vocabulary with your child and encourage your child to explain their thinking as they solve subtraction problems.

Se les pedirá a los estudiantes que expliquen las estrategias que usan para resolver problemas de resta. Por favor repasar el vocabulario de matemáticas con su hijo y anime a su hijo a compartir su pensamiento mientras resuelven los problemas de resta.
