Our work includes:

Homes

- ◆ Defending tenants in housing court to prevent evictions
- ◆ Preparing and submitting FEPS applications for rental assistance
- ◆ Advocating for public housing and Section 8 tenants facing loss of their lease or housing subsidy
- ◆ Helping tenants obtain repairs
- ◆ Assisting homeowners facing foreclosure

Families

- ◆ Representing survivors of domestic violence in family court and in divorce proceedings
- ◆ Helping eligible immigrants apply for U.S. citizenship
- ◆ Helping eligible survivors of domestic violence and human trafficking apply for immigration relief
- ◆ Representing students with disabilities and non disabled students in school suspensions and obtaining special education services
- ◆ Helping seniors over the age of 60 prepare wills and powers of attorney
- ◆ Helping families at risk of ACS intervention and reuniting families separated by foster care.
