

Ice Cream, You Scream, We All Scream for Reading

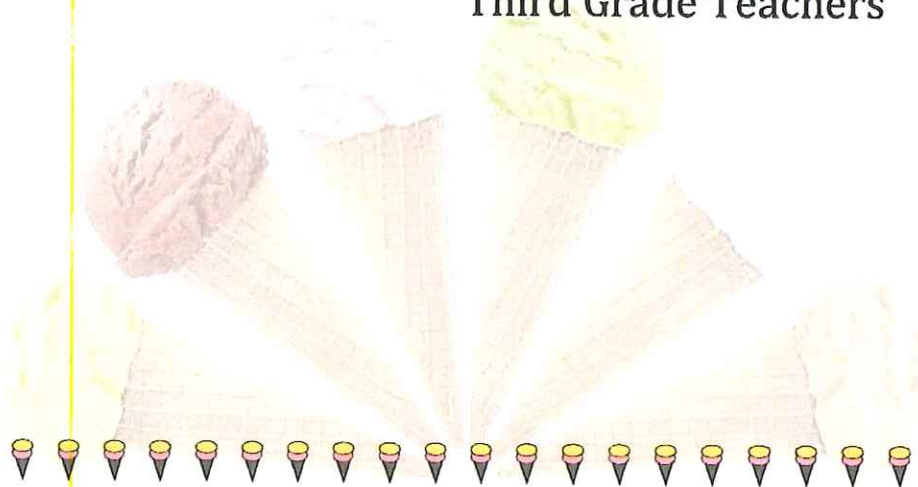
Dear Parents/Guardians,




