REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

GOOD EVENING. I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO WELCOME THOSE OF YOU IN ATTENDANCE AT TONIGHT'S BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING.

1. PARCC Testing in grades 3 through 5 started today Tuesday, April 24, 2018. The classroom settings were finalized and our technology was ready to go. I know that I have mentioned to the Board that one of our continued goals is to maintain a 95% participation on the test. It seems that we should make that 95% rate again this year.
2. We are in phase three of our building security plan and will have everything completed before the end of this school year. These security enhancements will again assist with our overall security plan.
3. Ms. Silva and I will be discussing the evaluation of the special education programs with the Board possibly at our Board meeting on May 22nd. We are going to share a summary of the programs and issues that impact the delivery of services to special needs students.
4. The Robotics Competition was held at the Carlstadt Public School on Wednesday afternoon, March 28, 2018. It was once again a very entertaining and interesting time for all.
5. This year marks our 152nd Annual Picnic for the children in Carlstadt. The date has been set for Saturday June 23, 2018.
6. We will be holding a technology night for parents next Wednesday, May 2, 2018, in our computer labs on the second floor. This is open to all parents who wish to learn more about google, genesis or any other technology that would help them with understanding how to work with the school based technology that the district currently utilizes. We are also looking to set up an evening with our senior citizens to assist them with basic, intermediate and maybe even advanced technology.
7. The 8th grade graduation is scheduled for Tuesday June 26, 2018. Graduation will again be held in Gym "B". This will not interfere with Becton's graduation which is being held on Wednesday, June 20th.
8. Marisa Signorella has been selected as this year's recipient of the Bergen County Teacher/Educational Services Professionals Recognition Program for the 2017-2018 school year. This year's luncheon is going to be held on May 24th. Congratulations to Mrs. Signorella on this award.

9. Under the Harassment, Intimation, and Bullying Law, I as Superintendent am required to report to the Board of Education no later than the date of the next Board meeting results of investigations regarding HIB when those investigations have been completed. We had zero incidents investigated since the last Board of Education meeting.

REPORT OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/BOARD SECRETARY

- I am happy to announce that the County has approved our tentative budget submission and we are able to proceed with the final review. The Public Hearing for the budget will be held in coordination with the May 7th Board Meeting. The meeting will begin at 6:00pm.
- The district held a bid opening on March 16th for the previously discussed Façade Project and Roof Replacement Project which will be taking place this summer. You will see the award of these bids as a motion for approval under the Finance section of tonight's agenda and both have come in under budget.
- Also part of tonight's agenda is the approval for our participation in the ACES program for our gas and electric needs. ACES, the Alliance for Competitive Energy Services has procured electricity and natural gas at discounted prices for New Jersey schools. With approximately 430 member school districts, ACES is the largest energy aggregation program in the state.
- Finally, in reference to the Lincoln School Bell, a decision has not been made as to how the bell will be displayed. Weir welding conducted an assessment and provided feedback on the viability of placing the bell in the cupula. The Buildings and Grounds committee will meet to discuss this topic futher, however at this time we will be focusing on the completion and approval of the 2018-2019 budget.

6. **WHEREAS**, the Alliance For Competitive Energy Services (hereinafter referred to as “ACES”), an alliance composed of the New Jersey School Boards Association (hereinafter referred to as “NJSBA”), the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, and the New Jersey Association of School Business Officials, will from time to time during the Effective Period as defined below solicit bids from natural gas suppliers for retail natural gas supply services including interstate transportation to the local natural gas distribution utility company (Natural Gas Supply Services) through an energy aggregation program in which NJSBA will act as Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS in accordance with the “Public School Contracts Law”, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 *et seq.*, and the Electric Discount and Energy Competition Act, N.J.S.A. 48:3-49 *et seq.* (“EDECA”) and the regulations promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Carlstadt Board of Education is a Participating member of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System and is eligible thereby to obtain natural gas services for its own use through one or more contracts to be awarded to natural gas suppliers following said bids for natural gas services pursuant to the aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will from time to time during the Effective Period (from date of adoption through May, 2023, hereinafter referred to as “Effective Period”) issue one or more Requests for Bids for natural gas services on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law and EDECA; and

WHEREAS, due to significant volatility and the potential for price increases in the wholesale natural gas market, Participating Members will preauthorize the Lead Agency to award contracts for Natural Gas Supply Service in each service territory to one or more natural gas suppliers that submits bids which are reasonably forecasted to provide estimated savings to the Participating Member based upon its previous natural gas usage and utility provided Basic Gas Supply Service rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will only award contracts for said Natural Gas Supply Services to natural gas suppliers that submit bids with pricing reasonably estimated to be lower than the utility-provided basic gas supply service; and

WHEREAS, the District agrees to purchase all Natural Gas Supply Services for its own use during the Effective Period through any natural gas supplier(s) awarded a contract, it being understood that the term of any one contract shall be subject to the provisions of Public School Contracts Law; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will notify the Department of Community Affairs' Division of Local Government Services by mail prior to the issuance a Request for Bids for natural gas supply services, with the understanding that if the Division of Local Government Services does not respond within 10 business days, it will be deemed to have approved the issuance of the Request for Bids or the Request for Rebids.

NOW, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the District binds itself to the ACES Cooperative Pricing System ##E8801-ACESCPS to purchase all natural gas supply services needed for its own use during the Effective Period from the natural gas supplier or suppliers awarded a contract for natural Gas supply services by the Lead Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System is hereby authorized to execute a master performance agreement that obligates the district to purchase natural gas at the terms and conditions stated therein with a third-party supplier or suppliers who have been awarded the contract or contracts by the Lead Agency on behalf of the participating members of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS (or any CPS number to be assigned in the future), and provided further that all such contracts shall be at prices reasonably forecast and estimated by the Lead Agency to provide savings to the districts relative to the price charged for basic gas supply service by the natural gas public utility that would otherwise provide such service; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that ACES is authorized to continue to bid to obtain natural gas services at any time during the Effective Period on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System including, for example, a rebid if energy market conditions do not initially lead to a successful bid, on additional dates to be determined by the Lead Agency; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. The authorization provided to the NJSBA pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5)), and the Local Public and Public School Contracts Laws Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1 et seq.) shall be valid until May, 2023 (the Effective Period) at which time the Cooperative Pricing System will be subject to renewal. Any rescission of this resolution shall not affect any Agreements entered into prior to such rescission or expiration.

regulations promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Carlstadt Board of Education is a Participating member of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System and is eligible thereby to obtain electric generation services for its own use through one or more contracts to be awarded to electric power suppliers following said bids for electric generation services pursuant to the aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will from time to time during the Effective Period (from date of adoption through May, 2023 hereinafter referred to as "Effective Period") issue one or more Requests for Bids for electric generation services on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law and EDECA; and

WHEREAS, due to significant volatility and the potential for price increases in the wholesale electric market, Participating Members will preauthorize the Lead Agency to award contracts for Electric Generation Service in each service territory to one or more electric power suppliers that submit bids which are reasonably forecasted to provide estimated savings to the Participating Member based upon its previous electric usage and utility provided Basic Generation Service rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will only award contracts for said electric generation services to electric power suppliers that submit bids with pricing reasonably estimated to be lower than the utility-provided basic generation service; and

WHEREAS, the District agrees to purchase all electric power needed for its own use (exclusive of on-site electric generation sources) during the Effective Period through any electric power supplier(s) awarded a contract, it being understood that the term of any one contract shall be subject to the provisions of Public School Contracts Law;

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will notify the Department of Community Affairs' Division of Local Government Services by mail prior to the issuance a Request for Bids for electric generation services, with the understanding that if the Division of Local Government Services does not respond within 10 business days, it will be deemed to have approved the issuance of the Request for Bids or the Request for Rebids.

NOW, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the District binds itself to the ACES Cooperative Pricing System ##E8801-ACESCPS to purchase all electric power needed for its own use (exclusive of on-site electric generation sources) during the Effective Period from the electric power supplier or suppliers awarded a contract for electric generation services by the Lead Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System is hereby authorized to execute a master performance agreement that obligates the district to purchase electricity at the terms and conditions stated therein with a third-party supplier or suppliers who have been awarded the contract or contracts by the Lead Agency on behalf of the participating members of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS (or any CPS number to be assigned in the future), and provided further that all such contracts shall be at prices reasonably forecast and estimated by the Lead Agency to provide savings to the Districts relative to the price charged for basic generation service by the electric public utility that would otherwise provide such service; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that ACES is authorized to continue to bid to obtain electric generation services at any time during the Effective Period on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System including, for example, a rebid if energy market conditions do not initially lead to a successful bid, on additional dates to be determined by the Lead Agency; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. The authorization provided to the NJSBA pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5)), and the Local Public and Public School Contracts Laws Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1 et seq.) shall be valid until May, 2023 (the Effective Period) at which time the Cooperative Pricing System will be subject to renewal. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to all but the three (3) lowest bidders, if requested; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board's Construction Counsel is authorized to prepare the contract for the Project, obtain the documents required thereby, and transmit same to the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon receipt and approval of the Contractor's bonds, insurance certificate and other documents required by the Contract, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to the remaining bidders.

WHEREAS, the Board has determined Roof Management, Inc. to be the lowest responsible bidder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A: 18A-1, et. seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Project to Roof Management, Inc. in the amount of Seventy Eight Thousand Dollars (\$78,000.00), which amount includes a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5,000) allowance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to all but the three (3) lowest bidders, if requested; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board's Construction Counsel is authorized to prepare the contract for the Project, obtain the documents required thereby, and transmit same to the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon receipt and approval of the Contractor's bonds, insurance certificate and other documents required by the Contract, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid securities to the remaining bidders.
