

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Mrs. Megan Slamb read the Superintendent's report:

1. The Carlstadt Public School District has completed the process of administering this year's NJSLA test which has taken the place of the PARCC administration. This year's test administration started last Monday, April 29th and ended just recently. We stressed the importance of having the student's take part in the administration of the test. Our participation numbers were maintained at a least a 95% participation rate. The 5th and 8th grade students took the Science State Assessment today and again tomorrow.
2. I have completed all of the Superintendent merit goals and can either discuss them in closed session tonight or at the June 18th meeting. It is your decision.
3. As of today, we have 26 students enrolled for next year's Pre-Kindergarten program. These numbers are not inclusive of the pre-school disabled students. There are 51 students registered for Kindergarten next year. Both grade level numbers are expected to rise especially over the summer. I will discuss with the Board the possibility of two sections of Pre-K at a date in the near future.
4. This year marks our 153rd Annual Picnic for the children in Carlstadt. The date has been set for Saturday June 15, 2019.
5. There are 555 students registered in our Pre-K through Grade 8 programs as of today. We are still far below the capacity of this building should a large number of students ever register in the near
6. The district's Art show was held last Tuesday night from 6-8 pm on the second floor. There was a tremendous amount of projects for all attendees to see. A special thank you to Caitlin Gold, school staff and administration for putting all of this together.
7. The 8th grade graduation is scheduled for Friday, June 21, 2019. Graduation will again be held in Gym "B". This will not interfere with Becton's graduation which is being held on Thursday, June 20, 2019.
8. Under the Harassment, Intimation, and Bullying Law, I as Superintendent am required to report to the Board of Education no later than the date of the next Board meeting results of investigations regarding HIB when those investigations have been completed. We had zero incidents investigated since the last Board of Education meeting. All of the proper steps, meetings and notifications took place. Remedial interventions and appropriate disciplinary actions were taken dependent upon the findings of the investigation.

REPORT OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/BOARD SECRETARY

- Now that the final Budget Submission has been approved, the Business Office has begun closeout processes for the 2018-2019 Budget. This includes preparations for end of year purchasing, system rollover, and the 2019 audit.
- The district architects have prepared the summer 2019 Bids and the Bid opening is scheduled for May 30th at 2:00pm.
- The district also released a Request for Proposals for the Food Service Management Company. The state requires that every 5 years we revisit the contract for FSMC and consider any changes that need to be made. This year, the state department of agriculture has changed the bid process and is requiring a very different format for the proposals. The process has also become more stringent. The proposals will be subject to committee review and scoring. And a recommendation will be made at the conclusion of the review process.
- Finally, I would like to extend my gratitude to Janet Olsson and Evan Morley who collaborated to install a new vestibule camera and connected monitor in the main office. This allows for better facial recognition as well as a clearer image for the staff in the main office when providing entry. In addition, Ms. Olsson has been orchestrating various camera and software upgrades throughout the building which are providing us with better imagining and increased security.
