

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

GOOD EVENING. I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO WELCOME THOSE OF YOU IN ATTENDANCE AT TONIGHT'S BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING.

1. The Carlstadt Public School District continues to be in the process of preparing for this year's NJSLA administration which has taken the place of the PARCC administration. We will again stress the importance of having the student's take part in the administration of the test. Our participation numbers increased again last year over the previous year maintaining at least a 95% participation rate. We also continue to understand that it is a parental right to not have their child participate in the test administration. I will keep the Board updated continually as we move closer to the administration of the test.
2. The Carlstadt Public Schools Robotics Club will be attending the year's first South Bergen Jointure Commission Competition on January 22, 2020 at Robert L. Craig School in Moonachie. Much thanks to Mrs. Ydrovo, our robotics club advisor for assisting greatly with these competitions and assisting the students with their preparation.
3. The middle school winter concert is scheduled for this Thursday, January 9, 2020, at 1:30 and 7:00 p.m. in Gym A.
4. Ms. Evans will be reporting on the Carlstadt Public School District 2019-2020 District Goals in her report following mine this evening.
5. As of today, we have 40 students enrolled in the Pre-Kindergarten program. These numbers are inclusive of the pre-school disabled students.
6. There are 535 students registered in our Pre-K through Grade 8 programs as of today. We are still far below the capacity of this building should a large number of students ever register in the near future.
7. I have discussed next year's Calendar with the Superintendents from East Rutherford and Becton. We try our best to align the 3 districts when possible. Half days and professional days will continue to be at each district's discretion based upon need and contractual language.
8. Our next tentative Board of Education meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 21st at 7:00 p.m.
9. Under the Harassment, Intimation, and Bullying Law, I as Superintendent am required to report to the Board of Education no later than the date of the next

Board meeting results of investigations regarding HIB when those investigations have been completed. We had zero incidents investigated since the last Board of Education meeting.

REPORT OF ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

Good evening and Happy New Year,

It was amazing to see the enthusiasm of the staff and students about starting a new year at CPS. Students came back to school energized and ready to learn! In a few weeks, the administrative team will be starting the second round of observations and we look forward to seeing all the creative and amazing lessons teachers are preparing for their classes.

- We have been continuing to make progress towards achieving our district goals. Here are some updates:
 - The Green Team has started to work on our action plan. One of our ATP classes, led by Ron Magnusson, is taking pictures of items students can purchase in the cafeteria. The students will place these pictures above the proper recycling receptacles so items are sorted correctly.
 - We have scheduled two assemblies for the Spring for students in grades kindergarten and 4th grade. These are free assemblies sponsored by the Bergen County Utility Association. Students will learn about recycling through cute puppets and an interactive program.
 - We are starting to plan our 50th anniversary Earth Day Celebration with many activities to celebrate our Earth. We are excited to make this year's celebration the biggest one yet! Mary Anderson will be spearheading this event and because of her passion for recycling, she is the perfect person to plan this day!
 - The Health and Wellness Committee is in the process of planning for our spring fair. At the end of January, 15 staff members, including teachers, paraprofessionals, support staff, secretaries, will be trained in Mental Health First Aid. This course will afford these staff members the opportunity to learn strategies to help youth who are struggling with mental health issues. We hope to include some of these wellness strategies at our fair.
 - Teachers are using strategies learned at the Conquer Mathematics workshops to plan creative and hands-on lessons for their students. Students are benefiting from the use of manipulatives and small group instruction during RTI periods to grasp difficult mathematical concepts.

I will continue to work towards these goals and report back at future meetings.

REPORT OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/BOARD SECRETARY

- After some delays with the shipments of parts, I am pleased to report that the Boiler Exhaust project is under way. We are anticipating completion next week. Once complete we will be able to re-open Ms. Mello's music room and the gym locker rooms. We will be scheduling Garden State Environmental to come out and do another assessment of the air quality once the project is complete.
- The business office has begun working on the 2020-2021 budget. Once the new finance committee is determined a budget calendar will be distributed which will include a committee meeting for review of the proposed budget.
- The district architects will be out with coming Wednesday to conduct some surveying work in preparation for the summer 2020 bids. I will keep the board informed as we move through that process. We are looking to complete the bid and award the contracts by the March 17th Board Meeting.
- Finally, as noted in the Reorganization agenda, I have obtained by QPA license, and as such the district has a new Bid threshold of \$40,000. This will grant us more flexibility when it comes to projects and purchases that need to be made during this year and the coming years.
