2020-2021 COVID19 Back to School Plan

General Information

- Phase I - Total virtual learning for all students. Students do not report to school.
- Phase II - Students will report to school on alternating days to adhere to social distancing protocols and maximum occupancy capacity limits.
 - A Days - Monday, Wednesday, alternating Friday
 - Students with last names that begin with letters A - H
 - B Days - Tuesday, Thursday, alternating Friday
 - Students with last names that begin with letters I - Z
 - Students who are in the same household but have different last names will be able to be in the same group.
 - Guardians must contact the school (985-532-8218) to change the group.

General Information Continued

- Phase III - All students will attend school daily in the traditional school setting.
 - The district will determine when schools will enter Phase III
- Parents may request for their student to remain a virtual learner. Changes may be made at the end of each nine weeks.
 - This includes students transferring from virtual to the school setting and vice versa.
- Students who are virtual may participate in sports as well as other extracurricular activities.

General Information Continued

- Everyone must wear a mask/face covering to school (as well as while on the bus). Face shields will not take the place of a mask/face covering.
- Masks/face coverings are considered to be part of the uniform policy.
- Masks/face coverings must be free of inappropriate wording/graphics.
- Students will be allowed to bring water bottles to school and may be consumed outside of the classroom. These bottles must be filled from home as the water fountains will remain shut off. Water will be available for purchase at the vending machines in the common area.

Before School Begins: Chromebook Pick Up

- ALL students will be assigned a Chromebook and power cord (regardless of schedule or if they have available technology within the home)
- The only computers allowed for classroom use will be those issued by the school
- MiFis will be distributed to those who completed the survey and were approved by the district
- Schedules and Google Usernames and Passwords will be distributed during Chromebook pick up
- Chromebook pick up will occur August 6 - 7, 2020

Before School Begins: Chromebook Pick Up

- Masks/face coverings must be worn; Social distancing will be enforced
- Students should park in the Senior Parking Lot as well as the Visitor's Side Stadium Parking Lot
- Students will line up in Trojan Hall and back hallway
- Schedules will be handed out by the guidance counselors before students enter the library
- Chromebook/MiFi distribution will occur in the library; Students will be required to sign stating that they received and are responsible for their Chromebooks/MiFis
- Students will then use the designated exit and leave campus, as campus tours will not take place.

District Plan

- August 10 - 21: Virtual learning via assigned Chromebook
- August 24: Students will begin the A/B Schedule (See Slide 2 for specific details)
- September 7: Labor Day Holiday; No School
- September 8: Teacher Professional Development; No School for Students
- September 9: Students will continue A/B Schedule unless determined otherwise by the district

Virtual Learning

- Teachers will video themselves teaching and upload the video to Google Classroom
- All materials needed for class will be distributed to students via Google Classroom
- Students will submit assignments through Google Classroom for grading
- While virtual (August 10 - 21), teachers will maintain daily office hours using Google Meet (students may ask for clarification, questions, concerns, etc)
 - 8 - 10 am & 1 - 2 pm

School Day: Phase II and Phase III

- Students will report directly to homeroom or breakfast when arriving on campus
 - School will open at 6:40 am each morning
 - Students may purchase Express Breakfast to eat in homeroom
- Drop off students: Students will have their temperature taken each morning before getting out of the drop-off vehicle as well as in homeroom.
 - Students with a temperature of 99.4 or higher will return to the drop off vehicle
- Bus riders/student drivers: Students will have their temperature taken each morning in homeroom.
 - Students with a temperature of 99.4 or higher will be sent to an isolation room; Parents will be notified by the nurse to make arrangements for their students to be picked up

School Day: Phase II and Phase III

- Students will not dress out for PE. They will participate (indoors) in their school uniforms. Outdoor activities will be permitted when temperature and/or weather allow.
- Students will be expected to sit in an assigned seat in the classroom.
- Desk will be cleaned between classes.
- Students will have a staggered dismissal for buses and car line/walkers.
- School will be normal school hours 7:15-2:15.
- School uniforms are still expected.

School Day: Phase II and Phase III

- Tape will be placed on the floor to show directional flow to assist with class exchange. Smaller hallways will be one-way traffic (U-halls) while larger hallways (Trojan Hall, Main Hall) will accommodate two-way traffic. The front stairway will be used by students going to the second floor. The back stairways will be used for students walking down to the first floor.
- Desks will be cleaned at the beginning of each class period.
- Students will sanitize hands at a minimum of once every two hours as well as BEFORE and AFTER lunch.

Symptoms of COVID/Positive for COVID

- Symptoms include: fever of 99.4 or higher, cough, difficulty breathing, vomiting, and/or diarrhea
- If you have symptoms or test positive, you should stay quarantined for a minimum of 7 days
- Students/staff who are symptomatic will be assessed by the school nurse
 - Based on assessment, students may be sent to an isolation room; Parents would then be notified by the nurse to make arrangements for their students to be picked up
- Students/staff who test positive for COVID will be addressed on a situational basis as determined by the district
- Parents and guardians are asked to contact the school if their student has symptoms and/or tests positive
