

**LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS
2018-2019**

Qualifications, Limitations, & Conditions

American Legion Auxiliary Unit 349, Raceland

Award Value: \$1,000

1. The American Legion Auxiliary Unit 349 will award a \$1,000 scholarship to a graduate of CLHS or to a member of Unit 349 or to a descendant of a member or deceased member of Unit 349 who is graduating from high school.
2. The recipient of this award may attend any college of his or her choice in the state of Louisiana.
3. The recipient will present himself or herself to the registrar's office for registration in order to be eligible for the next semester.
4. The recipient must earn 12 semester hours of credit with at least a 2.0 GPA for the first semester.
5. When enrolling for the second semester, the same procedure as above will be followed.

American Legion Post 83, Lockport

Award Value: \$1,000

1. Applicant must have financial need and at least a 3.0 GPA.
2. Applicant must be of good moral character.
3. Applicant must show purpose and/or educational goal.
4. Applicant must show traits of Americanism in list of school activities.
5. Applicant must have participated in school-sponsored activities.
6. Payment will be \$125 per semester.

Bollinger Shipyards Partners in Education Scholarship for College or University

Value: One \$4,000 scholarship distributed at \$500 per semester for 8 semesters.

1. Applicant is a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.
2. Applicant must have a GPA of 3.0 or better and have taken the ACT.
3. Applicant may choose to attend any state college or university of choice and choose any curriculum leading towards a bachelor's degree.
4. The applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee. Members of the committee will be designees of Bollinger Shipyards Board of Directors. The committee will select students for first, second and third choice.
5. The Bollinger Shipyards Scholarship will be paid through a check from Bollinger Shipyards. One-eighth will be paid at the beginning of each of eight consecutive semesters. A student who graduates from college in less than four years may receive the remaining balance of the scholarship if the student continues his/her education.
6. At the end of each semester, the recipient will be required to show evidence that he or she has maintained a 2.5 average (per semester, not cumulative) as a full time student (12 or more hours) and must be enrolled for the next semester as a full time student, or forfeit the remainder of the scholarship. This must be presented to Ms. Denise Martin for review and authorization of a payment for the subsequent semester.
7. Some consideration will be given for the applicants whose parent(s), step-parent(s) or grandparent(s) is/are employed at a Bollinger Company.
8. Applicant should attach a typed one page narrative explaining the following question: **WHY ARE BOTH THIS SCHOLARSHIP AND A COLLEGE EDUCATION IMPORTANT TO ME?**

Bollinger Shipyards Partners in Education Scholarship for Community or Technical College

Value: \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.

The purpose of this scholarship is to reward students who demonstrate qualities that would recognize them as possible potential employees for industry.

1. Applicant is a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.
2. Applicant has a grade point average of 2.5 or better.
3. Applicant may attend any accredited community/technical school of his or her choice.
4. Applications will be reviewed by a scholarship selection committee. Members of the committee will be designees of Bollinger Shipyards Board of Directors. The committee will select students for first, second, and third choices.
5. The scholarship will be paid through a check from Bollinger Shipyards. One-fourth (\$250.00) will be paid at the beginning of each of four consecutive semesters.
6. At the end of each semester, the recipient will be required to show evidence that he or she has maintained a 2.5 average (per semester, not cumulative), enrolled a minimum of six hours and registered for the next semester, or forfeit the remainder of the scholarship. All information must be presented to Mrs. Denise Martin for review and authorization of a payment for the subsequent semester.
7. Some consideration will be given for the applicants whose parent(s), step-parent(s), or grandparent(s) is/are employed at a Bollinger Company.

Coach Dudley Hillman Memorial Scholarship

Award Value: \$1,000

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior at Central Lafourche High School.
2. Applicant must have a GPA of at least 2.0.
3. Applicant may attend any accredited post-secondary two-year or four-year school.
4. Applicant must have participated in football, golf, track, or cross country at Central Lafourche High School.
5. The recipient will be selected by a committee; selection will be based on financial need, scholastic achievement, extracurricular activities, and community service.
6. Value of the scholarship is a one-time payment of \$1,000.
7. The scholarship money will be paid at the beginning of the first semester upon presentation of proof of enrollment into a post-secondary institution.

Crystal Guidry Memorial Scholarship
Administered by the Lockport Lions Club

Award Amount: \$1,000

1. The Crystal Guidry Memorial Scholarship is offered to a Central Lafourche High School graduate.
2. Applicants must have lettered in at least one sport during his or her senior year.
3. Student must have a high school GPA of at least 3.25.
4. Student must show leadership qualities and be involved in community service.
5. A one page essay will be required and should explain why this scholarship and a college education are important to the student.
6. Alternates will be chosen in case the recipient has received multiple scholarships in other areas.
7. Student must have taken the ACT to qualify.
8. The student must attend a college in Louisiana.
9. Payment will be made in the amount of \$1,000 paid over 8 semesters. If the student graduates in less than 8 semesters, the balance of the scholarship will be paid upon proof of graduation. This will be paid through the Lockport Lions Club.
10. At the end of each semester, the recipient will be required to show proof that he or she has completed that semester with at least a 3.0 grade point average, as a full time student and is enrolled for the next semester as a full time student, or forfeit the remainder of the scholarship. This must be presented to the Lions Club member designated by the club to review the evidence and authorize a scholarship payment for the subsequent semester.

Dr. Bobbie Morris Scholarship

Award Value: \$1,600

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior at Central Lafourche High School.
2. The applicant must have a high school GPA of at least 3.25 and must maintain a 2.8 GPA in college.
3. The applicant may attend any accredited four-year college, community college, or technical school in Louisiana.
4. The applicant must carry at least 12 hours per semester.
5. The applicant must complete the narrative described on supplemental page.
6. Selection of the recipient will be based on scholastic standing and extra-curricular activities.
7. The value of the scholarship is \$1,600, payable at \$200 per semester for 8 semesters.
8. The initial scholarship money will be paid at the beginning of the first semester upon presentation of proof of enrollment. Subsequent payments will be made upon presentation of grades for the previous semester (2.8 GPA) and proof of enrollment for the following semester.

James E. Trant Memorial Band Boosters Scholarship

Value: \$500

1. This scholarship is provided to one qualifying senior participating in the spring commencement exercise of Central Lafourche High School.
2. The applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and must have taken the ACT.
3. The applicant must be a current band member with 4 consecutive years in band, participated in all the required activities of the band program and in good standings with the band per the rules of the Code of Conduct.
4. The applicant must have applied to an accredited school of learning in the state of Louisiana.
5. The applicant must carry a full schedule of classes while at Central Lafourche High School.
6. The total cash value of the scholarship is \$500. The scholarship will be paid by the CLHS Band Boosters, Inc.
7. Write a one-page, 100 -150 word essay on "How band experience has influenced my life".

Lionel Hanley Memorial Lockport Lions Club Scholarship

Award Value: \$2,000

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.
2. The applicant must reside within the boundaries served by Central Lafourche High School and must have maintained an overall high school GPA of at least 3.0.
3. The applicant must plan to enroll in a program leading to a Bachelor's Degree at any university of their choice.
4. The applicant must have taken the ACT assessment.
5. A one page essay is required in which the applicant explains why this scholarship and a college education are important to the applicant.
6. All applications returned will be reviewed by a committee made up of members of the Lockport Lions Club. This committee will select three students: one for the first choice; one for the second choice; and one for the third choice. If the student selected receives more lucrative scholarships, this scholarship will go to alternatives.
7. The value of the scholarship is \$2,000. The scholarship will be paid by the Lockport Lions Club to the recipient in eight (8) equal parts: 1/8 will be paid at the beginning of each of eight (8) consecutive semesters. A student who graduates from college in less than 8 semesters may receive the remaining balance of the scholarship during the semester that he or she graduates.
8. At the end of each semester, the recipient will be required to show proof that he or she has completed that semester with at least a 3.0 grade point average, as a full time student and is enrolled for the next semester as a full time student, or forfeit the remainder of the scholarship. This must be presented to the Lions Club member designated by the club to review the evidence and authorize a scholarship payment for the subsequent semester.

Lockport Bidy Basketball Scholarship

Value: Varies

1. Applicant must be a graduating senior.
2. Applicant must have played basketball for Lockport Bidy Basketball League.
3. Applicant must be planning to attend some type of post-secondary institution.
4. Applicants must write a half-page to one page essay on how Bidy Basketball affected their lives, including any memorable moments they had during the years they played Bidy Basketball.

Loraine B. Grabert National Honor Society Scholarship, CLHS

Award Value: \$350

The only students that may apply for this scholarship are those seniors who are members in good standing with the CLHS National Honor Society.

Nikki Brignac Garner Memorial Scholarship

Award Value: \$500

1. Applicant must be a graduating senior at Central Lafourche High School.
2. Applicant must complete the Louisiana minimum requirements for high school graduation by the end of the spring semester for the current academic year.
3. Applicant must write a well-developed essay on why he/she is deserving of this scholarship.
4. Applicant must have a minimum of 2.5 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
5. Applicant must have taken the ACT.
6. Applicant must intend to major in one of the following areas:
Education, English, Journalism, Film or Theater

The above-listed criterion has been approved by the scholarship committee which was assembled to decide who will receive the scholarship.

Raceland Sons of the American Legion, Squadron 349

Award Value: \$800 (four-year degree) or \$400 (two-year degree)

1. The scholarship is awarded to a graduate of Central Lafourche High School or a member of the Sons of the American Legion Squadron 349 or Auxiliary Unit 349 who is graduating from high school.
2. The recipient of this award may attend any four-year or two-year college or university in the state of Louisiana.
3. The person must have an overall average of at least 2.5 in order to apply.
4. The scholarship is valued at a total of \$800 for a four-year degree or \$400 for a two-year degree. This will be paid at a rate of \$100 per semester, over eight consecutive semesters for a four-year degree or four consecutive semesters for a two year degree, provided the student maintains at least a 2.0 average each semester as a full time student and makes available the proper materials to verify these requirements at the end of each semester.
5. A student who drops out of school or fails to maintain the requirement will forfeit the remaining value of the scholarship.

Richard Bollinger/Bob Barker Lockport Lions Club Scholarship

Award Value: \$2,000

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.
2. The applicant must reside within the boundaries served by Central Lafourche High School and must have maintained an overall high school GPA of at least 3.0.
3. The applicant must plan to enroll in a program leading to a Bachelor's Degree at any university of their choice.
4. The applicant must have taken the ACT assessment.
5. A one page essay is required in which the applicant explains why this scholarship and a college education are important to the applicant.
6. All applications returned will be reviewed by a committee made up of members of the Lockport Lions Club. This committee will select three students: one for the first choice; one for the second choice; and one for the third choice. If the student selected receives more lucrative scholarships, this scholarship will go to alternatives.
7. The value of the scholarship is \$2,000. Riley John Bourgeois Memorial Scholarship

Award Value: \$2,500

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior of Central Lafourche High School.
2. The applicant must have maintained an overall high school GPA of at least a 3.5.
3. The applicant must have scored at least a 21 on the ACT.
4. Payment will be made in the amount of \$312.50 over 8 semesters for a total scholarship value of \$2,500.
5. Proof of enrollment in college will be required to receive the first payment.
6. Recipient must maintain a 3.0 grade point average in college. Proof of grade point average and enrollment for the next semester will be required to receive payments for the remaining semesters.
7. If the recipient finishes a semester below a 3.0, the recipient will be placed on probation for one semester. If the grade point average is brought back up to a 3.0 during the probation period, the recipient will be allowed to continue the scholarship. If not, the remainder of the scholarship will be forfeited.

Trojan Athletic Association Scholarship/Hugh Foret Memorial Scholarship

Award Value: 2 scholarships at \$500 each

1. The applicant must be a graduating senior at Central Lafourche High School.
2. Applicant must be a participant in athletics, cheer, or dance during their junior and senior year.
3. Applicant must have a 2.0 GPA or greater.
4. Applicant may attend any accredited post-secondary school.
5. The Trojan Athletic Association board members will select the recipients.
6. A female student will be chosen as the recipient of the TAA Scholarship.
7. A male student will be chosen as the recipient of the Hugh Foret Memorial Scholarship.

VFW Post 3665, Raceland Scholarship

Award Value: \$1,000

1. The Freddie John Falgout VFW Post 3665 will award a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to one member of the graduating class at Central Lafourche High School each school year.
2. All graduating seniors are eligible and encouraged to apply.
3. The recipient will be selected by the post scholarship committee.
4. Student selected may attend any accredited school of learning in the state of Louisiana.
5. Payment will be made directly to the individual at the rate of \$125 per semester provided the following conditions apply:
 - a. Provide scholarship committee chairman proof of enrollment.
 - b. Earn a minimum of 12 semester hours and maintain a GPA of "C" or better. (Furnish the scholarship committee chairman at the end of each semester a copy of grades.)
6. Students who fail to maintain a GPA of "C" or better will be dropped from the program. However, the student may be reinstated when his/her grades have been raised to "C" or better average.
7. Students who leave school or enroll in a school out of the state will be terminated from the program.
8. Students must show good leadership qualities and have participated in extracurricular activities.
9. The post commander or delegate will attend the awards ceremony to present the scholarship to the recipient.

Applicant must type a well developed essay on why he/she is deserving of this scholarship.
(Double-spaced – return with your application packet)

How Bidy Basketball affected my life (including any memorable moments)
(Half-page to one page typed, double-spaced – return with your application packet)
