First Practice permitted March 5, 2018 **Last Day to Play** Tuesday, May 15, 2018

First Scrimmage permitted after 8 Practice days for Team (March 14) – 6 Practice days for Individual

First Game permitted after 10 Practice days for Team (March 16) – 8 Practice days for Individual

Minimum Number of Contests To be eligible for sectional, intersectional or state competition, a team must have completed in six (6) school scheduled contests which occurred on six (6) different dates during the season.

Maximum Number of Regular Season Games - 16

Team Sports: An individual is eligible for the team if he/she has been an eligible participant on a team in that sport in that school for a minimum of six (6) scheduled contests during the regular season. For football, a student must be an eligible participant for a minimum of three (3) contests.

Team/Individual and Individual Sports: An individual must also have represented their school in six (6) scheduled contests during the season to be eligible. These required contests must occur on six (6) different dates and must be conducted prior to the conclusion. {NYSPHSAA Handbook, pg 104, #25 a}

SECTION ONE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE DECISIONS

1. Seeding of all teams accepted for tournament play.
2. The contest site(s), contest dates and starting times are determined by the Tournament Committee. Changes due to inclement weather will be made by the Coordinator and/or Tournament Committee. These changes are considered binding on all schools applying to and participating in the Tournament.
3. The Tournament Seeding Committee has final authority as to who will be accepted in either the Class A, Class B, Class C or Class D Tournament in the best interests of Section One Boys Lacrosse.
4. The tournament Seeding Committee reserves the right to rescind bids, alter schedules, sites or playing times due to circumstances that are deemed unacceptable to the best interest of Section One Boys Lacrosse and its member schools.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION

1. All schools and participants representing their schools must follow the eligibility requirements as stated in the NYSPHSAA Handbook.
2. All entry forms for participation in the Section One 2018 Boys Lacrosse Tournaments must be submitted no later than **Tuesday, May 15, 2018.** (Results in Score Board, Roster and Non-Preferred)

ALL CONTESTS MUST BE PLAYED BY TUESDAY, MAY 15, 2018.

BOYS LACROSSE STANDARDS

1. All games shall be played under National Federation Lacrosse Rules with only changes being those adopted by the NYS Lacrosse Rules Committee.
2. Home team at games is responsible for providing approved NFHS/NOCSAE Lacrosse Balls. If home team does not have the balls then referee will give a short time to get them and/or ask visiting team if they have proper lacrosse balls. If visiting team does have the proper ball then game can start but there will be no face off. Ball is given to visiting team at the midline and there will be no face-off at the beginning of the game. If visiting team does not have the lacrosse balls for the game the game will be postponed until which time the approved lacrosse balls are present.
3. CROWD CONTROL and SUPERVISION of SPECTATORS is the responsibility of each school. COACHES are STRONGLY URGED to have SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION PRESENT with spectators at their respective games.
4. The HOME TEAM should provide a table and chairs for the scorers and timekeepers.
5. It is recommended that the HOME TEAM provide an adult as an official timer.
6. Ball retrievers at the end and/or sidelines must wear a lacrosse certified helmet.
7. Interrupted Game: The procedure for rain delay or interrupted contest will be administered in accordance with NFHS Lacrosse Rules; Rule 3 Section 5, p.27. Any suspended game or interrupted contest will begin at the time of discontinuation unless a variation of the rule have been agreed by both schools.
 - The suspended game shall be resumed from the point of interruption at the next available mutually agreed upon date.
 - Both teams are permitted to make roster changes.
 - By mutual agreement of the opposing coaches and approval of the referee, any period may be shortened or game terminated.

Boys Lacrosse Rules Changes - 2018

- 1-2 Adopt the 120-yard unified girls and boys field as an allowed field option.
- 1-7-5 Note: Pockets of nontraditional synthetic material manufactured for lacrosse are permitted. The pocket must meet the specifications of 1-7.
- 4-3-3n n. A contrasting color between the head and the top glove must be visible on the shaft at face-offs. The circumference of the shaft shall not exceed 3.5 inches.
- Note: This can be accomplished with the original shaft color, paint, a single wrap of tape, or other material.
- 1-9-1g Note: Beginning in 2022, the home team will be required to wear white jerseys, and the away team will be required to wear non-white jerseys.
- 4-3-3d The official shall make certain that the reverse surfaces of the crosses match evenly in that the top of one head lines up with the throat of the other and are perpendicular to the ground.
- 4-9-2o A goal will be allowed if the shot is released prior to the end of the period.
- 4-18-4 PENALTY: Conduct foul on the defensive player. A second violation by the team will be enforced as releasable unsportsmanlike conduct, served by the offending player.
- 6-5-2x x. Failure to wear a required mouthpiece properly (unless it comes out during play).
- 6-10-2 The stall warning remains in effect until a goal is scored, a shot that hits the goal pipes, shot that hits the goalie or hits his equipment, the defensive team gains possession of the ball or the period ends resulting in a faceoff. After the team has been warned, stalling shall be called if the ball leaves the goal area in any manner other than as a result of a shot on goal or a touch by the defensive team.

Boys Lacrosse Rules Changes – 2018 (cont.)

7-3 RESUMING PLAY AFTER PENALTY: When a penalty occurs and the ball is in the offended team's offensive half of the field, the ball shall be put in play by the team awarded the ball, at the spot where the ball was when play was suspended. If the ball was in the goal area when play was suspended, it shall be restarted nearest to the spot of the ball at the time of the whistle, 20 yards laterally outside the goal area.

7-8-2k A second defensive foul is committed during the final two minutes of regulation play with the team that is ahead possessing the ball unless a scoring play is imminent.

Signals Stall warning off (fair catch signal from football) signal 40.
