Minimum Number of Contests To be eligible for sectional, intersectional or state competition, a team must have completed in six (6) school scheduled contests which occurred on six (6) different dates during the season.

Team Sports: An individual is eligible for the team if he/she has been an eligible participant on a team in that sport in that school for a minimum of six (6) scheduled contests during the regular season. For football, a student must be an eligible participant for a minimum of three (3) contests.

Team/Individual and Individual Sports: An individual must also have represented their school in six (6) scheduled contests during the season to be eligible. These required contests must occur on six (6) different dates and must be conducted prior to the conclusion. {NYSPHSAA Handbook, pg 104, #25 a}

CLASSIFICATION
TOURNAMENT FORMAT

All tournaments will use a single elimination format to advance through the tournament. Class C will have a double elimination playoff. If a Sports Committee feels there is rationale to justify a change from Section One policy, they may request an alternative as part of their draft proposal after review by the conferences.

Classes with three applicants or less will compete in a format acceptable to the Sports committee after discussion with the school districts. Class D has **NO** teams this year.

NO DATE CHANGES THROUGHOUT TOURNAMENT WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE CHAIRMEN.

TOURNAMENT BASEBALLS

A.D.'s Note: The Spaulding baseball – Pro-NFHS (#41-100 HS) will be used for ALL SECTIONAL, REGIONAL & STATE GAMES. Each team is to bring one dozen Spaulding baseballs to EVERY game. The HOME team will supply the first dozen and the visiting team the second dozen as needed. Once a team advances to REGIONAL play and beyond, the HOME SECTION will supply the balls. Each team should always carry a dozen Spaulding balls just in case.

TOURNAMENT PLAYER RULES

1. The NYSPHSAA Eligibility Rules and the National Federation Rules will be adhered to. (Note Sportsmanship Standard, NYSPHSAA Handbook.)

TOURNAMENT BUS TRAVEL

1. If you are traveling over the Tappan Zee or Bear Mountain Bridges for Sectional games, please plan for extra travel time.
2. If you are a high seed, it is wise to reserve a bus/coach prior to Sectional play for Regional or State travel.

TOURNAMENT TIMES AND SITES

1. All weekday games (except Finals) will start at **4:30 p.m.**, unless schools agree to another time. The Chairperson(s) & SECTION ONE must be informed of the change.
2. **SATURDAY FIRST ROUND WILL START AT 11:00 AM.**
3. In the event two or more games are played on the same day, the first game will start at 10:00 a.m. The next game will start as soon as possible after the conclusion of the first game, depending upon travel, etc.
4. Out-bracket games, if needed, 5/17 @ 4:30 p.m.
5. **PLEASE NOTE: NO DATE CHANGES ALLOWED. The Chairmen must approve any date or time changes throughout the tournament.**
6. The top seeded teams will be the home site team and bat last. Your seed dictates your site, home or away. This will include all games in the tournament except Finals. (Ex: Team seeded 16th, travels to team seeded 1st). First seeded team is home team, bats last, and supplies balls.)
7. If field problems occur, (rain, markings, conditions, etc.), home team must find alternate site or travel to the visitor site but remain the higher seed. The Chairmen will have the final word on when and where the game will be played. Games rained out will be played on a next day basis.
8. The Section One Committee **recommends** we follow the *NF rule that all fences should be at least 300 feet down the lines and 350 feet to center. Schools without the distance may erect a portable fence, at a height that is necessary for a ball to travel a distance of 300-350 feet. Any field that the Committee feels is dangerous or unsafe for play cannot be used in Sectional play.

If a school needs help in determining whether their field is playable, safe, or meets the required distance, representatives from your Coaching Association(s) will meet with you and make recommendations to the school and Section One Baseball Committee for action.
9. **All Class Finals are to be held at Boulder Stadium. Class C Final will be at Pace University. If a second game is needed, the final will be at Boulder Saturday.**
 - High Seed has choice of Dugout
 - Each team must bring 1 dozen SPAULDING STATE BASEBALLS
 - Pregame, on field, warm-up: High seed first 15 min., Opponent last 15 min.
 - **NO SEEDS OR GUM!**

TOURNAMENT TIMES AND SITES (cont.)

10. Home school is responsible for the AED and an Athletic Trainer, if possible. **Both schools are responsible for providing adequate supervision at their games.**
11. **Regional/State Preparation:** Please prepare the following if you reach the Semi-Finals of the Sectionals: **SECTION ONE TEAMS WILL USE THE FIRST BASE DUGOUT WHEN HOST NO SEEDS!**
- A. Team Photo – **VERY IMPORTANT FOR THE PROGRAM.**
- B. Team Roster – **Roster information** must be forwarded to the NYSPHSAA office by simply going to our web site and following the instructions below. **BRING EXTRA COPIES FOR THE STADIUM ANNOUNCER & PRESS.**
- **Go to: www.nysphsaa.org and click on "forms" on the left menu.**
 - Once you are in "forms", choose "roster form" for your sport and complete the roster.
 - Before you submit the roster, print yourself out a copy for your file, then you'll have it just in case we did not receive it electronically for some reason.
 - Please have coaches submit roster forms when they complete Sectionals. Always have extra copies Available.
 - You must contact Al Roy: AlRoy27@yahoo.com to ensure that your rosters are submitted. Communicate to Al which region you are from Capital - AA, A, B or South East - C, D.
 - State finals: Co-Chairs: Tim Harkness (607) 725-3220, Matt Ferraro (607) 760-3725.
 - Call Tim **AFTER** you win the Regional.
- C. **Before Sectionals, reserve a bus if you are a top seeded team.**
12. The following fields **cannot** host Sectional Games: **Irvington & Dobbs Ferry. Several Yonkers sites.**

TOURNAMENT AWARDS

1. Each Sectional Class Champion will receive a large plaque and **up to twenty-five (25) medals.**
2. Each Class Runner-up will receive a small plaque.
3. Awards will be presented immediately after the game on the field for all players, coaches, and team personnel.
4. Each team in the Finals will receive twenty-five (25) T-shirts after their game. Team beverages will be provided by BODYARMOR Super Drink provided by the Section One Baseball Committee.
5. An MVP Award will be selected for each Class Final. These awards will be donated by Section One Westchester/Rockland Coaches Association, Dutchess County Baseball Coaches Association and by the Dutchess County, Westchester County/Putnam and Rockland County Umpires Association.
6. There will be a "PLAYER'S PLAYER AWARD" presented to each team to a player that expressed himself on the field in an outstanding manner. SPONSORED BY JAN MAR TROPHY & APPAREL COMPANY of New Rochelle.
7. Each CLASS CHAMPION will receive the DOM CECERE GOLD GLOVE AWARD sponsored by David Pope and the GENEROSO POPE FOUNDATION.
8. Regional/State Champions will receive plaques and certificates at the State games. You are allowed 23 team members. Bring a voucher for over 29 admissions.

Section I and NYSPHSAA Tournament (Sectionals, Regionals & States)

TIED & SUSPENDED GAME RULE (page 111 NYSPHSAA Handbook)

1. An Official game is 5 innings or 4 and a half if the home team is ahead. If a winner can be determined and no more baseball can be played that day, the game is over and a winner is declared. The game does not have to go 7 innings.
2. If a game is stopped before it becomes an official game, the game is a suspended game. This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter, etc. should all be recorded in scorebook.
3. If the game is stopped after having gone long enough to be an official game, however a winner cannot be determined due to a tied score. This game becomes a tied/suspended game at that point. This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter, etc. should all be recorded in scorebook.
4. If a game is stopped after having gone long enough to become an official game and;
 - a. the visitors score a run or runs in the top half of the inning. The game reverts back to the last completed inning and either a winner is declared or we have a tied/suspended game.

(Sectionals, Regionals & States)
TIED & SUSPENDED GAME RULE (page 111 NYSPHSAA Handbook)

OR

- b. the visitors score a run or runs in the top half of the inning and the home team does not complete their at bat. The game reverts back to the last completed inning and either a winner is declared or we have a ties/suspended game. If we have a tied/suspended game, we pick up from that point (Visitors' runs in the top half of the inning and home team runs in bottom half count). This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter, etc. should all be recorded in scorebook.
- c. The home team ties the game in the bottom half of the inning but doesn't complete the inning. If we cannot play anymore, we have a tied/suspended game at that point. This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter, etc. should all be recorded in scorebook.

OR

- d. The home team takes the lead in the bottom half of the 5th or 6th inning, then game is called. At that point the home team is declared the winner.

GENERAL SECTIONAL PROTEST PROCEDURE

Baseball: Protest Procedure

- **The on-site protest committee (2 Umpires and Home AD (or rep)) will rule on any protests immediately to ensure a timely continuation of the game so the tournament can progress. (Must have current rule book on site).**
- There will be no appeal of this protest committees' ruling.
- Sectional Chairs should be notified ASAP of the protest via cell phone:

- **Protests on judgment calls are not allowed! Only misapplication of the rules will be allowed to be protested. A decision on the protest will be made by the protest committee onsite after consultation with the Chairmen and/or the rules interpreter (Steve Ciraco, 914-943-8703).**
- **IF the game is called because of weather, darkness, etc., Scorebooks (home team official) should be held by each team for review/verification prior to restart of game.**
- **Umpires keep lineup cards for restart of game for verification.**
- **Every fact must be written in the book and signed off by coaches and umpires, e.g. number of outs, base runners' position, count on batter, etc., as much information as possible.**

TOURNAMENT UMPIRES

1. **All coaches are required to rate their umpires by 5/12 in order to participate in the Tournament.**
2. Two (2) umpires will be assigned until the Semi-Finals; three will be assigned from Semi-Finals on.
3. Tournament umpires will be selected from the rating sheets submitted by BOCES/coaches. Umpires will be assigned by the BOCES office.
4. Regional Tournament Games: Umpires will be assigned by the BOCES office.
5. State Tournament Games: Two (2) Umpires from Section One will be assigned by Section One.

- 1 If a pitch is thrown on a balk call, the pitch will NOT count for the purposes of this rule
- 2 A pitcher at any level who reaches the pitch count limit in the middle of an at-bat will be allowed to finish that hitter.
- 3 Schools will have the responsibility to maintain all pitching charts. They will also be required to make any game chart available to any school prior to any game to show availability of pitchers for that given day.
- 4 During games each team will record pitch counts on the official NYSPHSAA pitch count form, this should not include warm-ups or pick off attempts. After each half inning the pitch counts will be confirmed by both teams. Any discrepancy will be resolved based on the records of the home team pitch count chart.
- 5 At game's conclusion, the NYSPHSAA pitch count form will be signed by both head coaches or designated representative.
- 6 Any violation of this rule will be considered in the same light as a school using an ineligible player. The game will be forfeited.
- 7 As per the NYSPHSAA handbook any additional penalties may be imposed at the school or section level.
