Federal Funding at GMMS

GMMS is now a Title I school, Title I funds will be used to employ a math intervention teacher, ELA reading tutor, parent involvement nights, and supplies to use for intervention classes. Title I, Title II, Title III, and Title VII funding is used on the GMMS campus. This brochure is to help inform you of the federal dollars at work here for children at our school.

Federal programs are coordinated by supervisors at the Lockport Media Center. The following federally funded programs or services at GMMS are as follows:

- Homeless-McKinney Vento Act-Title I-Part A funds are used and coordinated through our counseling center for homeless student needs such as school supplies and uniforms, academic assistance, and other family support services. Professional School Counselor, JoAnn Matherne is the School contact person. Please speak to our professional school counselors for services.
- Title I Part D- Neglected and Delinquent programs will be newly funded by transitioning students between school and the juvenile justice facility. Contact the media center for more information.

Federal Dollars Working for You!!

- Migrant Education- Title I Part C funds academic intervention for migrant students. Recruitment services, tutoring services, resources to support migrant families regarding family need, school supplies, and summer enrichment camp are all examples of use of these funds.
- ELL/ESL (English Language Learners/English as a Second Language)- Title III funds teachers to work with student that have limited English language skills. Furthermore, a new focus will be to fund professional development for classroom teachers teaching ELL/ESL students.



- Indiana Education Program- Title VII funds services for Native American Students and their families. Native American students through academic and enrichment programs have camps and cultural activities. Some cultural activities are drumming and regalia classes.
- Title II- Title II funds curriculum specialist who provide support and assistance to teachers. Some sites have Master and Mentor teachers who perform professional development activities, funding to assist teachers to become highly qualified, and materials for staff development can be used with Title II funding. Lastly administrators can use Title II funds to assist with leadership training.
