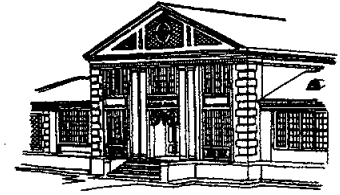


GOLDEN MEADOW MIDDLE SCHOOL

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GMMS Parent Involvement Plan 2019-2020

Goal: To enhance the instructional program and academic achievement of students at Golden Meadow Middle High School by involving parents in all aspects of the school's activities.

Objective: The administration, faculty, and staff will provide a variety of programs to promote parent and family engagement to improve the academic performance of students. Documentation of these programs will include sign-in sheets, copies of the monthly school calendar, and school visitations.

 - d. Athletic activities
 - e. Beta Club and Science Club community events
 - f. Co and Extra Curricula Club sponsored events such as Quiz Bowl, 4-H, and any other school related sponsored club activities
4. Involve parents in field trips as chaperones and/or drivers
5. Encourage parents to volunteer as guest speakers
6. Host an open house event
7. Mailed notes home and/or emails from the faculty and staff
8. Uses of web related services such as JPAMS, Facebook, or other web based means.
9. Send invitations to parents for activities and ceremonies
10. Hold parent-teacher conferences, which may be initiated by the parent.
10. Provide parents with progress reports and /or report cards every 4½ weeks
11. Invited community member for Veteran's day program and other community events,
